

Dear Mr. Ramsey:

By your letter of January 6, 1986, we have received the protest to the Amended Application to Appropriate Water, No. R-2021, submitted by Douglas C. Nelson on behalf of Electrical District No. 8 (ED-8).

It is recognized that the only water subject to appropriation as against present rights would be the floodwaters which otherwise flow over the diversion points downstream from the Buttes damsite which serve lands having rights under the Gila Decree. Since the beginning of the administration of the Gila Decree, significant amounts of water have flowed over these diversion points. Such waters could only be conserved by the construction of storage facilities such as Buttes Dam and Reservoir. The United States has proposed to construct such facilities to capture, control, and distribute these floodwaters as part of the Federal Central Arizona Project (CAP). Therefore, the amended application was properly submitted to secure this appropriative right.

The amended application does recognize that the proposed appropriation would be subject to valid existing rights, such as rights under the Gila Decree. Accordingly, if the ED-8 can establish that it has valid existing rights to the surplus floodwaters, we would agree that the proposed appropriation would be subordinate to those rights. However, we suggest that a hearing may be necessary to determine if any entity has any valid usable right to the surplus floodwaters.

Due to the nature and scope of CAP, the application does not state the specific lands or populations to be served by this water. CAP, of which Buttes Dam is only a part, will serve a large number of water uses, users, and geographic areas with project water garnered from several sources.

The Bureau of Reclamation's position with regard to planning and construction of Buttes Dam was fully explained in our September 5, 1984 Motion to Continue. On September 7, 1984, your department vacated the scheduled hearing and granted an indefinite continuance of the hearing.

In summary, the ED-8 protest does not present any valid reasoning to deny the amended application or to substantiate the claim that the uses are against the interest and welfare of the public, conflict with vested rights, and are a menace to public safety. It should also be noted that this protest is not timely in regard to the protest period granted in 1973, and that the list of protestants has been set for some time. A duplicate-original of this letter is enclosed.



By your letter of December 13, 1985, we have received the protest to the Amended Application to Appropriate Water, No. R-2021, submitted by Mr. Douglas C. Nelson on behalf of Paloma Ranch.

It is recognized that the only water subject to appropriation, as against present rights, would be the flood waters which otherwise flow over the diversion points downstream from the Buttes dam site which serve lands having rights under the Gila Decree. Since the beginning of the administration of the Gila Decree, significant amounts of water have flowed over these diversion points. Such waters could only be conserved by the construction of storage facilities, such as Buttes Dam and Reservoir. The United States has proposed to construct such facilities to capture, control, and distribute these flood waters as part of the Federal Central Arizona Project (CAP). Therefore, the amended application was properly submitted to secure this appropriative right.

The amended application does recognize that the proposed appropriation would be subject to valid existing rights, such as rights under the Gila Decree. Accordingly, if the Paloma Ranch can establish that it has valid existing rights to the surplus flood waters, we would agree that the proposed appropriation would be subordinate to those rights. 




MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION TO CONTINUE

1
2 An application was filed on June 9, 1960, by the United
3 States through the Department of Interior, Bureau of Reclamation,
4 with the Arizona State Land Department to appropriate and store
5 water at the Buttes Dam site on the Gila River about 14 miles
6 upstream from Florence, Arizona. That application was predicated
7 on a study completed in 1960 pursuant to § 9(a) of the Reclamation
8 Project Act of 1939, 53 Stat. 1184 to investigate the Middle Gila
9 River Project, Arizona. According to the application, the water
10 to be stored would be used to irrigate Indian and non-Indian land
11 in the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project.

12 In 1968 Congress enacted the Lower Colorado River Basin
13 Act (Public Law 90-537) authorizing the Central Arizona Project.
14 Buttes Dam and Reservoir are authorized features of that project.
15 (43. U.S.C. § 1521(a)). Pursuant to that authorization, planning
16 studies and construction have been undertaken. These activities
17 have been prioritized so that main system features such as the
18 aqueducts and pumping plants would be completed first.

19 To reflect that Buttes Dam was an integral part of the
20 Central Arizona Project, an amendment to the application was filed
21 in 1973. Based on that amended application, a hearing was set but
22 it was continued until February 9, 1981, in order to give the
23 Bureau of Reclamation the opportunity to complete the advance
24 planning and required environmental studies. However, those
25 studies were not completed because of the demands of the Central
26 Arizona Water Control Study (CAWCS)(the Orme Dam alternatives
study) which was given first priority. Studies on Buttes Dam were

1 continued as part of the CAWCS, but when Buttes Dam was dropped as
2 an alternative from the CAWCS, the studies were interrupted due to
3 lack of resources.

4 Prior to the February 9, 1981 hearing the Bureau of
5 Reclamation moved for a continuance in order to complete the
6 studies that had not been finished due to the CAWCS priority. On
7 January 7, 1982, the Deputy Director of DWR vacated the February
8 hearing and scheduled a new hearing for April 12, 1983.

9 Although the Bureau anticipated in early 1982 that 14
10 months would be a sufficient amount of time within which to
11 determine the feasibility of the Buttes Dam Project, that was not
12 the case. The Bureau had determined that two remaining alterna-
13 tives warranted further detailed study. One of those alternatives
14 was Buttes Dam. It was estimated that by June of 1984 the Bureau
15 should have sufficient information to determine if either alterna-
16 tive was justified. Accordingly, a new hearing was scheduled for
17 September 11, 1984.

18 At this time the Bureau of Reclamation has determined
19 that there is no viable alternative to Buttes Dam. The Dam itself
20 is justified at the interest rate under which the Central Arizona
21 Project was authorized. However, at this time the Bureau feels
22 that circumstances outside the agency's control will again force
23 delays in the construction program for Buttes Dam.

24 Both federal and state appropriations are obviously
25 limited and, therefore, the funds available for the construction
26 of the Central Arizona Project are restricted. Buttes Dam will
not have first priority for these limited funds; it is likely that

1 the four dams that comprise Plan 6, the alternative to Orme Dam,
2 will be constructed first. At the same time, pending litigation
3 on the Gila River will almost certainly affect all water rights
4 holders on the river as well as existing applications such as the
5 one at hand. Considering these circumstances, it does not appear
6 that the Bureau will be able to pursue the construction of Buttes
7 Dam in the near future. However, the Bureau of Reclamation has no
8 intention of permanently eliminating Buttes Dam from its construc-
9 tion program.

10 Since no competing applications exist, and no other
11 entity has shown any interest in pursuing this project, the Bureau
12 hereby respectfully requests that its application be held pending
13 further developements and that the hearing on this matter be
14 continued indefinitely.

1 those studies were not completed because of the demands of the
2 Central Arizona Water Control Study (CAWCS) (the Orme Dam altern-
3 atives study) which was given first priority. Studies on Buttes
4 Dam were continued as part of the CAWCS, but when Buttes Dam was
5 dropped as an alternative from the CAWCS, the studies were
6 interrupted do to lack of resources. Thereafter, the Buttes
7 Study Team Leader was required to devote an increasing amount of
8 time to CAWCS. Indeed, when the CAWCS team leader left the
9 Bureau of Reclamation to become the Pinal Active Management Area
10 Director for the Department of Water Resources in February 1981,
11 the Buttes Study Team Leader was reassigned to head the CAWCS.
12 Once Carol Erwin became the Buttes Study Team Leader late in
13 August of 1981, work on the Buttes Study as a Central Arizona
14 Project feature resumed.

15
16 The last hearing scheduled for this matter was set on
17 February 9, 1982. Prior to that hearing the Bureau of Reclamation





10. These preliminary technical studies showed that two alternatives could be viable at current planning interest rates (the interest rates currently applicable to federal reclamation projects). These alternatives were Buttes Dam and a desilting basin (located near Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam). The studies suggested that these two alternatives and the associated benefits should be studied in more detail.

11. The Bureau is now in the process of scheduling detailed studies on the design and cost of the two alternatives, and on the water supply and sediment control benefits. It is anticipated that the studies will be completed by June of 1984, and will supply sufficiently detailed information to determine if either of the two alternatives is justified. At that time a decision will be made on which (if any) alternative to pursue.



17 6. Environmental review was undertaken in connection
18 with the Central Arizona Water Control Study (known as CAWCS or the
19 Orme Dam alternatives study undertaken by the Bureau of Reclamation
20 and the Army Corps of Engineers).

21 7. Data collection and design work was done for Buttes
22 Dam and the Florence alternative during Stages I and II of the
23 CAWCS. Alternative studies were begun and public meetings were
24 held in mid-1980 to present the initial results. Buttes Dam was
25 eliminated from CAWCS at the end of Stage II. Due to the priority of
26 CAWCS which caused a lack of resources for the Buttes Study; studies
27 on Buttes Dam as a Central Arizona Project feature did not resume
28 immediately. The Buttes Dam Study Team Leader was required to

1 devote an increasing amount of time to CAWCS and ultimately was
2 redesignated the CAWCS team leader in February, 1981.

3 8. Work on Buttes Dam as a Central Arizona Project
4 feature resumed when I was selected as Buttes Team Leader in August,
5 1981.

6 9. The safety problems of Coolidge Dam are presently
7 being addressed; these problems and their potential solutions
8 directly affect the sizing and design of Buttes Dam.

9 10. Inflow design studies for Buttes Dam are presently
10 underway. Further, inhouse data collection efforts, as well as
11 implementation of contracts dating from 1972 in the areas of biology
12 and cultural resources, are continuing. During the past two years,
13 the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, under Bureau of Reclama-
14 tion contract, has collected data on the terrestrial and aquatic
15 wildlife habitat in the vicinity of Buttes Dam and Reservoir.

16 11. The Advance Planning Study will proceed to analyze
17 Buttes Dam and alternatives including the following:

18 a. Economic justification for the water supply, sediment
19 retention, and flood control functions.

20 b. Environmental and socio-economic impacts.

21 c. Water quality impacts.

22 d. Water rights impacts.

23 e. Fishery impacts and enhancement potential.

24 f. Wildlife habitat impacts and mitigation.

25 g. Archeological and historical resources impacts and
26 mitigation.

27 h. Identification of recreational potential.

28 i. Determination of mineral resources impacts.



I. INTRODUCTION

A. Principal source of information for report -

The former U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, currently named Water and Power Resources Services (WAPRS), prepared a 1961 report titled "Report on Buttes Dam and Reservoir, Middle Gila River Project, Arizona" (Middle Gila Report). This report provides a comprehensive source of information on the hydrology of the proposed structure. Since most aspects of the plan have either not changed or are yet to be finalized, there appears to be little reason to reanalyze most of the hydrologic investigations contained in the report. Consequently, the report contents have been used heavily both in the text of this report and in its appendixes, which are copied excerpts from the Middle Gila Report.



B. Location -

Buttes Dam and Reservoir are located about 14 miles east of Florence, and four miles upstream from the existing Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam used to divert Gila River water to the San Carlos Project as shown in Figure 1. The drainage area above Ashurst-Hayden Dam is 18,300 square miles, with 12,880 square miles lying above San Carlos Reservoir which effectively controls the Gila River to that point during nearly all years. The majority of the remaining area consists of the San Pedro River Basin with an area of 4,480 square miles and an additional 940 square miles which drain directly into the Gila River below Coolidge Dam.

C. Specifications -

The dam would be of earth construction and is proposed to have a total height of 290 feet above foundation with a hydraulic height of 210 feet. The active storage capacity allocation, if built as a multipurpose project with flood control provisions, is 100,000 acre-feet for irrigation conservation space, and 266,000 acre-feet for sediment and flood control for a total of 366,000 acre-feet.

II. PERTINENT HISTORY IN WATERSHED

A. Water development -

Lands along the middle Gila River have been irrigated by the Pima and Maricopa Indians and their predecessors since prehistoric times. The first judicially recognized diversion of water from the river by non-Indians was made in 1868. Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam was completed in 1922 and was designed to serve 27,000 acres of non-Indians on the Florence-Casa Grande Project and 35,000 acres of Indian lands. In 1925, Sacaton Diversion Dam was completed to serve a small area of Indian lands below Florence. The construction of Coolidge Dam was authorized in 1924 and completed in 1928 and is located 66 miles upstream from Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam.

B. Water rights and controversies -

The Middle Gila Report contains a good summary on this subject and has been copied, and included, as Appendix 1.

III. BENEFITS OF PROJECT

A. Increased Central Arizona Project (CAP) water supply -

The principal difference between the Buttes Dam and Reservoir Project described in the Middle Gila Report and the current use for Buttes Reservoir proposed by WAPRS is that the project will no longer primarily benefit the San Carlos Project; rather, its purpose is to contribute to the water supply of the Central Arizona Project. The quantity of water that can be developed for the CAP, as determined in recent studies by WAPRS, integrating Buttes into the overall CAP delivery system, is substantially the same as the quantity determined in the Middle Gila Report for the increased supply available to the San Carlos Project-- an average of about 50,000 acre-feet per year. The supply canal from Buttes Reservoir has also been eliminated in the current plan, and all releases would be made into the Gila River channel. The Buttes Reservoir releases would be diverted by the San Carlos Project at Ashurst-Hayden Dam in lieu of CAP Colorado River water deliveries which would be used elsewhere, thus adding to the total available



CAP supply. Appendix 2 contains a copy of pages out of the Middle Gila Report dealing with water supply.

B. Flood control -

The Middle Gila Report plan provided for 133,000 acre-feet of storage capacity in Buttes for flood control storage during the first 50 years. After the first 50 years of project operation, the flood storage pool in the reservoir will be encroached upon by sediment until project year 100 when the flood storage pool will be completely filled. Whether flood control benefits can be justified in the current plan has not yet been determined.

C. Sediment control -

The Middle Gila Report planned for 266,000 acre-feet of sediment storage in Buttes Reservoir (133,000 of which were allocated to flood control during the first 50 years) which would prevent encroachment of sediment on the conservation storage pool for an estimated 100 years. This sediment control would benefit the San Carlos Project by reducing sluicing requirements, lowering the annual canal maintenance costs, and by allowing use of spills from Buttes Reservoir which otherwise would be unuseable due to sediment. This last category is described on page labeled 52 in Appendix 2.

D. Fish, wildlife, and recreation -

The Middle Gila Report planned for a minimum pool of 7,000 acre-feet of storage that will provide a surface area of about 200 acres. The lake would be expected to provide a much needed additional area for these uses with only a small loss to dove and quail hunting opportunity.

IV. PRINCIPAL HYDROLOGIC IMPACTS

A. Decreased frequency and quantity of Ashurst-Hayden spills -

The Middle Gila Report determined the additional yield that could be obtained with Buttes Reservoir to be 52,700 acre-feet for the 1930-1956 period as indicated by reservoir operation studies. This figure was then rounded in the report to 50,000 acre-feet. One of the assumptions used in these determinations was that water would have been utilized by the San Carlos Project up to a flow of 1,200



cfs (capacity of the San Carlos Project main canal at Ashurst-Hayden Dam) so long as there was also no violation of the Decree Limitation of an annual diversion of six acre-feet per acre of decreed project acreage. Flows above 1,200 cfs would be controlled to the extent possible in the Buttes Reservoir conservation pool and these would constitute the increased yield attributable to Buttes Reservoir.

In the current plan for Buttes Reservoir, it would be operated to bypass flows that would be diverted for the San Carlos Project (natural plus released flows up to 1,200 cfs) at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam but would store for CAP use those waters that could not be diverted by the San Carlos Project.

In addition to the contribution of conservation storage in reducing Ashurst-Hayden spills, the sediment control of Buttes Reservoir spills also allows increased water utilization by the San Carlos Project, further reducing Ashurst-Hayden spills by an average of 13,600 acre-feet per year.

B. Effect on groundwater recharge -

The Middle Gila Report analysis showed (Table 4, labeled page 54 in Appendix 2) that total groundwater recharge in the San Carlos Project area is about the same with or without Buttes Reservoir. The assumptions used in their analysis are, as they point out, subject to error as there is little information available upon which to base many of the estimates. One of the assumptions, often cited by readers of the report as perhaps too high, is the percentage of Ashurst-Hayden spills that contribute to groundwater recharge. The Middle Gila Report uses a figure of 50%. The effect of lowering this figure would be to reduce the quantity of recharge occurring without Buttes Reservoir by a larger amount than it would reduce the quantity occurring with Buttes Reservoir.

Considering the current plan for the use of Buttes Reservoir, as a CAP project feature, the 15,000 acre-feet per year average increase in recharge of surface water diverted for irrigation shown in Figure 4 in Appendix 2



would be nearly entirely eliminated since the increased water supply developed by Buttes Reservoir would be used to benefit all CAP non-firm water supply users (primarily non-Indian agriculture for the first 20 project years).

WAPRS recommended allocation of CAP agricultural water to the Indian Reservations in central Arizona includes 173,000 acre-feet per year for the Gila River Indian community and the Arizona Department of Water Resources' recommended allocation of non-Indian agricultural water to the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District is 36,500 acre-feet per year during the first project year. At this time, the Indian allocation is considered to be a firm amount. Increasing all non-Indian allocations proportional to the recommended allocation by the Department of Water Resources to include an additional 50,000 acre-feet developed by Buttes results in an allocation to the San Carlos District of 38,550 acre-feet annually, or an increase of 2,050 acre-feet per year. Changing Table 4 in Appendix 2 to reflect a decrease in the proportion of spilled water contributing to recharge from 50 to 40 percent and the change in the use of the water developed by Buttes would result in the figures shown in Table 1.

V. SUMMARY

A. Hydrologic facts -

Since plans have not yet been firmly established for Buttes Reservoir by WAPRS, two of the least certain facts are the structure's final specifications and its associated justified benefits. The approach used in the Middle Gila Report to analyze the major hydrologic impacts of the project--the reduction in Ashurst-Hayden spills and consequent effect on the groundwater system serving primarily the San Carlos Project--appears to be a reasonable method, and the report contains a good presentation of the hydrologic facts pertaining to these impacts.

B. Hydrologic conclusions -

The primary hydrologic impact associated with the installation of Buttes Dam and Reservoir under the current WAPRS plan for its use as a Central Arizona Project feature would be to reduce the average quantity of groundwater recharge to the groundwater system serving the San Carlos Project. Under the assumption that the WAPRS Indian and Department of Water Resources non-Indian recommended CAP allocations are upheld, the loss of recharge is estimated to be approximately 7,000 acre-feet per year. Larger allocations of CAP water to the San Carlos Project would reduce this impact, and smaller ones could slightly increase the impact.

common ground-water basin. The domestic water systems serving most of the communities are owned and operated by private water companies. In a similar manner, domestic water for farm use is generally obtained from private wells owned by the farmers. Although none of such domestic and municipal water is delivered from the San Carlos Project system, the cities and towns as well as nonproject farm lands are dependent upon San Carlos Project water to the extent that such water recharges the common ground-water basin from which both project and nonproject water is pumped. There is no indication, however, that municipal and industrial water supply will become a function of the San Carlos Project operations in the future.

C. Water Rights and Controversies

1. Gila River Decree. Water rights for all lands in the Middle Gila River Project area were established by the Gila River Decree of 1935. This decree resulted from a Bill of Complaint filed in 1925 by the United States of America in the U. S. District Court for and on behalf of the Indian lands which were to constitute a part of the San Carlos Project. The complaint was filed for the purpose of having the project's water rights definitely determined and defined. Water users and canal companies, both above and below the proposed San Carlos Reservoir, were named as parties defendant. After extensive negotiations for a number of years, the parties by stipulation agreed to the entry of the decree which was adopted on June 29, 1935. (The United States of America vs. Gila Valley Irrigation District, et al - Globe Equity No. 59.)

The decree recognized the early irrigation activities of the Indians and the later irrigation practices of both Indian and non-Indian water users. It awarded lands on the Gila River Indian Reservation an immemorial right to the use of water for 35,000 acres and rights for 15,546 additional



acres with a priority as of 1924. In addition it granted rights to 50,000 acres of non-Indian lands in the San Carlos Project with various dates of priority. All San Carlos Project water rights are held in trust by the United States of America for the benefit of both Indian and non-Indian lands.

The decree also established the rights and priorities for lands in the Safford and Duncan-Virden Valleys and other areas. Diversion rights for non-Indian lands situated outside the San Carlos Project boundaries were granted to the various canal companies, and industrial and individual water users who diverted or pumped directly from the river. Diversion rights for Indian lands outside the San Carlos Project are held in trust by the United States for the benefit of the Indians.

The construction of Coolidge Dam was contemplated at the time of filing of the Government's Bill of Complaint. The Gila River Decree, therefore, not only granted direct diversion rights and priorities but also authorized the United States to store water in San Carlos Reservoir of the San Carlos Project to the extent of the full 1,285,000 acre-feet capacity of said reservoir at all times when waters are available above Coolidge Dam for such storage with a priority not later than June 7, 1924. Lands upstream from the reservoir were "apportioned" an amount of water equal to the amount stored in the reservoir and to be taken from the natural flow of the river without regard to downstream priorities. This right to divert "apportioned" water by upstream water users is in addition to the right to divert on regular priorities. In this respect, it should be noted that although water is apportioned to upstream water users on the basis of storage in San Carlos Reservoir, such water must be diverted from the natural flow of the river. Thus upstream water users have no assurance that "apportioned water" will be available when needed. Water supply records indicate that in many years the Safford and Duncan-Virden Valley water users have been unable to divert their full apportionment of water from the natural flow of the river.

The decree set forth certain principles as follows:

(a) Total allowable diversions from the river during each irrigation season are 6 acre-feet per acre.

(b) The rate of diversion from the stream is one cubic foot per second for each 80 acres. (May be modified under certain conditions.)

(c) Diversions can be made only for beneficial purposes.

(d) The irrigation season begins January 1 and ends on December 31 of each year.



The decree also provides "* * *" that the drafts on the stream by the upper valley defendants shall be limited to a seasonal year diversion which will result in an actual consumptive use from the stream of not to exceed 120,000 acre-feet of water; said consumptive use made in any seasonal year shall be determined by adding the recorded flows at a gauging station located in the Gila River at Red Rock Box Canyon above the heading of the Sunset Canal in New Mexico and a gauging station located in the San Francisco River immediately above its confluence with the Gila River and deducting from said sum the recorded flows at a gauging station located on the Southern Pacific Railway bridge crossing the Gila River near Calva, Arizona; * * *". No allowance is made for stream flow accretion in the above-described reach.

The decree provided for a Commissioner to be appointed by the court to carry out its provisions. Regulation of water distribution under this authority has been provided since January 1, 1936. The Commissioner is required to know at all times what water is available and to distribute it properly. On the first day of January of each year he must determine the quantity of water in available storage in the San Carlos Reservoir, and after deducting for evaporation and seepage losses during the time this water will be held in storage, apportion to water users in the Safford and Duncan-Virden Valleys, an equal amount of water to be diverted from the natural flow of the river for irrigation of their lands in disregard of priorities for diversions below Coolidge Dam. As additional waters flow into, are stored, and become added to the available stored water in the San Carlos Reservoir, further apportionments for diversions are made to upper valley users. This right to divert "apportioned" water by upstream users is limited to the maximum diversion duty established in



the decree. The gross limitation of annual diversion right as provided in Article VIII of the Gila River Decree is 6 acre-feet per acre, subject also to a consumptive use limitation of 120,000 acre-feet and may be made up of any combination of figures of diversion on priority plus diversion on apportionment.

2. Other Water Rights. The Gila River Decree adjudicated water rights for lands taking water from the main stream of the Gila River from the Duncan-Virden Valleys in New Mexico to the Gila Crossing area located below the San Carlos Project. The decree made no provision for existing water rights on the main stream above or below this reach of the river nor with those on the San Pedro River or other tributaries. There are existing water rights on the Gila River upstream from the Duncan-Virden Valleys and on tributaries which would not appear to be affected by potential improvements in the Middle Gila River Project areas.

Principal water users downstream from the project area are the Buckeye Irrigation Company, the Arlington Canal Company, and the Gillespie Land and Irrigation Company. All of these companies take water from the Gila River below the mouth of Salt River. The Buckeye and Arlington Companies jointly filed a suit in the Superior Court in Maricopa County, Arizona, against the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association and others in which it was complained among other things that the United States of America in its use of stored water on the San Carlos Project has interfered with and diminished the water supply of the two companies. Thereafter the companies agreed to confer with the Government for the purpose of working out a satisfactory settlement. The Secretary of the Interior appointed the late Clifford H. Stone of Denver, Colorado, as mediator who conducted mediation proceedings over a period of several



years and ultimately worked out a satisfactory agreement with the companies. Separate agreements were concluded with each of the companies and Articles of Agreement with both were signed on May 29, 1947, by the Secretary of the Interior. In accordance with the terms of the above agreements the United States of America paid the Arlington Canal Company the sum of \$10,000 to settle all past, present and future claims of the company against the United States. The agreement with the Buckeye Irrigation Company provided for the payment by the United States of \$104,400 in satisfaction of such claims. Each of the agreements contains provisions settling controversies respecting both surface and ground water. Each includes the following paragraphs:

"26. WHEREAS, the United States, in order to reconcile its differences with the Company and settle all past disputes and avoid future controversy with the Company over the right of the United States to control and use the waters of the Gila River and its tributaries above the mouth of the Salt River, is willing to pay the Company for a release of its past, present and future claims against the United States on account of the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project as now constituted or as it may hereafter be improved by the construction of new dams, (such as the 'Buttes') reservoirs or other facilities to make Gila River water more completely available to said project and the other lands hereinbefore mentioned, located at Gila Crossing, also the Florence-Casa Grande Project lands not included in said San Carlos Project; and * * *."

"31. Subject to the foregoing limitation the United States and/or its assigns may build for the San Carlos Irrigation Project such other storage and diversion dams on the Gila River or any of its tributaries at any point or points it may choose upstream from Sacaton Bridge and Diversion Dam. It is further agreed that subject to the same limitation the United States may drill such new wells and install pumps therein as it may deem necessary to more fully utilize its water rights enumerated in paragraph 9 hereof."

The Gillespie Land and Irrigation Company filed a complaint in intervention in the suit brought by the Buckeye Irrigation Company and the Arlington Canal Company against the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association and others, in which it sought to have its alleged rights in



and to the waters of the Gila River system determined and adjudicated and sought injunctive relief against both the plaintiffs and defendants in the suit in so far as their uses interfered with the claimed rights of the Gillespie Land and Irrigation Company. The Gillespie Land and Irrigation Company introduced both oral and documentary evidence to the court as to the extent, priority dates, and status of its claims to the appropriation and use of the waters of the Gila River. The complaint in intervention was dismissed by the Superior Court of Maricopa County when no proof was offered on the quantity of water beneficially used and the particular lands upon which used. The judgment dismissing the complaint in intervention was upheld when appealed to the Supreme Court of Arizona (75 Arizona Reports 377 - Gillespie Land and Irrigation Company v. Buckeye Irrigation Company, et al - No. 5273 Supreme Court of Arizona, May 18, 1953). In affirming the dismissal, the Supreme Court report stated that its judges are not determining that the Gillespie Land and Irrigation Company has no rights in the Gila River but that it failed to prove two of the essentials of a valid appropriation, that is the quantity of water beneficially used and the particular lands upon which used.

3. Applications to Appropriate Water. Private individuals, in the years 1928 and 1929, filed applications with the Arizona State Land Department for permits to construct a reservoir at the Buttes site and to appropriate water. Both of these applications were rejected by the State Land Commissioner in 1932 and no permits were ever issued.

The City of Tucson, in 1947, filed two applications with the State Land Department for permits to construct a reservoir at the Charleston Dam site on the San Pedro River and to appropriate water for municipal purposes. These applications were filed during the period the Central



Arizona Project was being considered. At that time it was contemplated that Charleston Dam would be constructed by the Bureau of Reclamation as a feature of that project and that Colorado River water would be available for exchange. The State Land Commissioner has not acted on these applications and no permits were issued.

In July 1960 the Bureau of Reclamation filed an application with the State Land Department for a permit to appropriate unappropriated waters of the Gila River system for use on the San Carlos Project. Notices of the application were subsequently posted in accordance with regulations of the State Land Department. Following posting of these notices, the City of Tucson filed a protest with the State Land Commissioner to the granting of the application and, at the same time, filed an application to appropriate approximately 30,000 acre-feet of water for municipal use, such water to be pumped from the San Pedro River Basin in the Cascabel area. Tucson's protest indicates that the City has recently acquired certain lands in the San Pedro River Basin near the settlement of Cascabel and may acquire additional lands in this area in the future. It appears from both Tucson's protest and application that the City will have no need for San Pedro River Basin water for at least 10 years and that the City's plans for obtaining the needed water are in the formulative stage at the present time.

The Bureau of Indian Affairs filed a protest to the granting of the application of the City of Tucson. On the basis of this protest it appears that the only water subject to appropriation as against present rights of the United States would be the flood waters which otherwise would flow over the four diversion dams which serve the San Carlos Project and other lands having rights under the Gila Decree. Since the



beginning of the administration of the Gila Decree the average annual flow over the Achurst-Hayden Diversion Dam has amounted to approximately 30,000 acre-feet. Such waters could be conserved only by the construction of storage facilities. The Bureau of Reclamation's recent application was filed for the purpose of establishing a right under State law to store and use these waters.

The City of Tucson considers that the ultimate municipal needs of the City may have to be met by taking water from the San Pedro River Basin. In the event that it is determined that the taking of these waters would interfere with present perfected rights, the City might need substituted storage capacity to provide for the rights so invaded. Any such necessary capacity, if agreeable to the City and the United States, could be reserved in Buttes Dam and Reservoir by allocating a portion of the cost of the structure to municipal and industrial water uses by the City. Financial feasibility of the Buttes development would not be impaired by such an allocation. It is believed that any possible conflicts of interest with Tucson can be worked out during the formulation of the City's water supply plans.

4. Ground-Water Restrictions. In order to participate in the benefits of the San Carlos Project, the non-Indian landowners were required to execute an agreement entitled "Landowners' Agreement with the Secretary of the Interior, San Carlos Project; Act of June 7, 1924". This agreement among other things provided in effect that, with the exception of the amounts required by the landowners for a domestic water supply, all



underground and diffused surface waters would be available to the project for development and use as an irrigation water supply. The agreement further provided that the landowners (1) would give to the United States or the project the necessary rights-of-way upon their lands so as to enable such waters to be developed and (2) would not use or permit others to use such waters contrary to any rules, orders, or regulations of the Secretary of the Interior. Under the terms of this agreement 114 wells are now operated by the San Carlos Project and since 1937 annual pumpage from project wells has averaged about 103,000 acre-feet per year.

Pursuant to the Arizona State Ground-Water Code, lands in and adjacent to the San Carlos Project have been designated as a "critical ground-water area". This designation prohibits the drilling of wells in the area for the development of new lands. It does not, however, restrict the deepening or rehabilitation of existing wells or the drilling of such replacement wells as may be needed to maintain the water supply for developed lands. It may be said in general that existing State laws do not limit or restrict the project in its use of available ground-water resources in so far as use on developed lands is concerned. The code is ineffective in preventing the continued pumping from existing project and adjacent nonproject wells which are in competition for the available ground water. The combined pumping greatly exceeds the recharge of the ground-water basin.

5. Water Right Controversies. Controversies over the use of Gila River water have existed for many years between water users of the San Carlos Project and those of the Safford Valley and other upstream irrigated areas. Conflicts of interest result from the fact the upstream and



downstream valleys are widely separated geographically and have different natural conditions and economic and operational problems, yet are dependent on a common surface water supply which has generally been inadequate to satisfy the needs of both areas. Water users in both valleys are interested in any developments on the reach of the river covered by the Gila River Decree or on its watershed, whether upstream or downstream from Coolidge Dam, because any such developments could affect water use under the decree; therefore, must not conflict with its provisions.

It was in recognition of the interrelationship of water problems in the two valleys that coordinated investigations were undertaken by the Bureau of Reclamation and the Corps of Engineers to consider the problems and needs of both areas under a comprehensive river basin plan of development.

The Buttes Dam and Reservoir plan of development outlined in this report was formulated primarily for the benefit of the San Carlos Project area. This plan, however, is of concern to the upper valley water users because Buttes Reservoir could be operated so as to affect upper valley apportionments under the Gila River Decree. Likewise, the Corps of Engineers plan of development for a flood control dam above the Safford Valley and channel improvements in the area is of concern to lower valley water users because these works could be operated so as to affect inflow to San Carlos Reservoir.

The need for agreement between the upper and lower valley water users on mutually acceptable operating criteria for Buttes Dam and Reservoir and all other features of the Middle Gila River Project plan is recognized by both interests as a prerequisite to construction and has been discussed over a considerable period of time. No agreements were concluded during



the present investigations because local interests prefer not to enter into negotiations until such time as full engineering, economic and financial details of all features of the Middle Gila River Project plan are available for consideration.

D. Potential Water Supply

Buttes Reservoir will provide sediment control and further conservation of stream flow to supplement the water supply of the San Carlos Project by regulating the stream flow originating downstream from Coolidge Dam. Studies were made to derive an estimate of the additional water supply which would be made available to the San Carlos Project by the operation of Buttes Reservoir in coordination with San Carlos Reservoir.

1. Period of Study. The 27-year period from October 1, 1929 through September 30, 1956 was adopted for the reservoir operation studies to determine the yield of Buttes Reservoir. Continuous concurrent records of stream flow are available for the 1915-1956 period for the gaging stations on the Gila River at Kelvin and below Coolidge Dam which are the key stations for the project reservoirs. Preliminary operation studies indicated that the use of the longer 1915-1956 period would not make a significant change in the estimated incremental yield attributable to Buttes Reservoir. Storage began in San Carlos Reservoir on November 15, 1928. However, dead storage required most of the inflow until the month of August 1929. Records for the selected 1930-1956 period present the history of the operation of the San Carlos Reservoir and the present project system and provide a more realistic basis for the economical and financial analysis in determining the repayment ability of the project particularly in the analysis of repayment of the existing project



the present investigations because local interests prefer not to enter into negotiations until such time as full engineering, economic and financial details of all features of the Middle Gila River Project plan are available for consideration.

D. Potential Water Supply

Buttes Reservoir will provide sediment control and further conservation of stream flow to supplement the water supply of the San Carlos Project by regulating the stream flow originating downstream from Coolidge Dam. Studies were made to derive an estimate of the additional water supply which would be made available to the San Carlos Project by the operation of Buttes Reservoir in coordination with San Carlos Reservoir.

1. Period of Study. The 27-year period from October 1, 1929 through September 30, 1956 was adopted for the reservoir operation studies to determine the yield of Buttes Reservoir. Continuous concurrent records of stream flow are available for the 1915-1956 period for the gaging stations on the Gila River at Kelvin and below Coolidge Dam which are the key stations for the project reservoirs. Preliminary operation studies indicated that the use of the longer 1915-1956 period would not make a significant change in the estimated incremental yield attributable to Buttes Reservoir. Storage began in San Carlos Reservoir on November 15, 1928. However, dead storage required most of the inflow until the month of August 1929. Records for the selected 1930-1956 period present the history of the operation of the San Carlos Reservoir and the present project system and provide a more realistic basis for the economical and financial analysis in determining the repayment ability of the project particularly in the analysis of repayment of the existing project



indebtedness. Records indicate that including the years subsequent to 1956 would have little effect on the results of the studies.

2. Reservoir Inflow. The inflow to the San Carlos Reservoir for the 1930-1956 period was considered as the sum of the measured flows of the Gila River at Calva and the San Carlos River near Peridot. Adjustments were made in the summary yield computations to account for the net gain or loss from the 389 square miles of intermediate drainage area between the upstream gages and Coolidge Dam for the 1930-1956 period.

The inflow to Buttes Reservoir would be the releases from San Carlos Reservoir at Coolidge Dam plus the additional net contribution from the intermediate drainage area. The net contribution of stream flow from the drainage area between Coolidge Dam and Buttes Reservoir was computed as the difference between the flows measured at the gage below Coolidge Dam and at the gage at Kelvin on the Gila River.

3. Irrigation Demand. The Gila River Decree permits diversions from the Gila River up to a maximum of 6 acre-feet a year per acre of decreed lands. In planning the 100,000-acre San Carlos Project, it was contemplated that diversions from the Gila River could furnish the water supply for 80,000 acres or 80 percent of the project requirement and that recharge to the ground-water basin of the area would permit pumping of a quantity of water sufficient to supply an additional 20,000 acres or 20 percent of the project requirement.

a. Water Requirements. Project records indicated that during the 1941-1944 period, storage in San Carlos Reservoir appeared ample to assure a full supply for the acreage irrigated and average surface water and pumped water for the 4-year period were about in the proportion contemplated in planning the project. During this period, an average of



75,757 acres was irrigated with a total water supply of 5.52 acre-feet an acre and an average of 3.69 acre-feet per acre was delivered to the farms (canal and lateral losses of one-third).

The irrigation water requirement of 5.52 acre-feet an acre was checked by an examination of the consumptive use requirements for the cropping pattern of the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District for the 1950-1954 period, which appeared representative of expected cropping practice. The consumptive use by the various crops was computed by the Blaney-Criddle Method and an estimated average annual consumptive use of 2.39 acre-feet of irrigation water per irrigated acre was derived for the 1950-1954 period. Assuming a farm irrigation efficiency of 65 percent, the farm delivery requirement would be 3.68 acre-feet per acre. With canal and lateral losses of one-third between the diversion point and the farm, the irrigation water requirement at the point of diversion would be 5.52 acre-feet per acre.

b. Annual Irrigation Demand. Assuming that 10 percent (for roads, rights-of-way, idle, etc.) of the 100,000 acre San Carlos Project would not be irrigated annually, then the 90,000 acres of irrigated land with an annual demand of 5.52 acre-feet per acre would have a total annual demand of 497,000 acre-feet. Under the plan that 80 percent of the project water requirement would be supplied by diversions from the Gila River, the total annual demand for surface water to be diverted would be 80 percent of 497,000 acre-feet or 398,000 acre-feet. This quantity was rounded to 400,000 acre-feet.

In the past, poor outlook for water at planting time has tended to limit the irrigated acreage. The additional water that would be made available by the operation of Buttes Reservoir would not be sufficient to



furnish a full supply for the San Carlos Project. It is expected that the farmers would continue their past practices of operations under water shortage conditions. Fluctuations in the demand used in the studies would cause only very small changes in the estimated yield of the system. To recognize that there would be a decrease in the irrigated acreage when stored water was not available at the end of March, the monthly demand in the studies was reduced to 75 percent of the normal demand.

When water would be spilling over Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam, diversions could be increased to 1,200 cfs (capacity of the canal) and maintained at that rate throughout the spilling periods so long as there would be no violation of the Decree limitation of an annual diversion of 6 acre-feet per acre of decreed project acreage. During these spilling periods, the pumping demand (25 percent of the surface water demand) would be supplied by surface diversions and the water diverted in excess of the irrigation demand for both surface and pumped water would be spread over the project lands to provide recharge to the ground-water basin of the area.

c. Monthly Irrigation Demand. The annual demand was distributed monthly in accordance with the monthly consumptive use requirements of the 1950-1954 crop pattern of the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District with consideration for present irrigating practices for the various crops in the area.

4. Sediment. Criteria adopted for the reservoir operation studies included the rule that the capacities of the reservoirs be reduced at the start of the studies to account for 50 years of sediment accumulation and that no further consideration be given to sediment in the operation studies.



a. Sediment Inflow to San Carlos Reservoir. The 1947 sedimentation survey indicated that 57,500 acre-feet of sediment had accumulated in San Carlos Reservoir. In the February 1951 report "Sedimentation in San Carlos Reservoir - Gila River, Arizona" (SCS-Tp-91) by Messrs. Eldon M. Thorp and Carl B. Brown of the Soil Conservation Service of the Department of Agriculture, it is estimated that the long-time sediment deposition in San Carlos Reservoir would average 5,000 acre-feet a year.

b. Sediment Inflow to Buttes Reservoir. Sediment sampling records were not available for the drainage area contributory to Buttes Reservoir. On the basis of the data obtained from sedimentation surveys of reservoirs in the Gila River Basin with consideration of unit runoff of water, mean annual precipitation, topography, soil types, and vegetation on the watershed, it was estimated that a reasonable long-time unit yield for the sediment contributing area of about 5,300 square miles to Buttes Reservoir would be 0.5 acre-feet per square mile per year. The estimated average long-time sediment inflow to Buttes Reservoir would thus be 2,650 acre-feet a year.

5. Reservoir Capacities for the Operation Studies

a. San Carlos Reservoir Capacity. The capacity of San Carlos Reservoir for the reservoir operation studies was considered as the capacity determined by the 1947 survey reduced by an additional 50 years of sediment accumulation (250,000 acre-feet) or about 960,000 acre-feet. Computations were made to distribute the sediment throughout the reservoir and adjust the area-capacity relationship for estimating the reservoir evaporation for the period of study.

b. Buttes Reservoir Capacity. The capacity of Buttes Reservoir for the reservoir operation studies was considered as 100,000 acre-feet



which would be the storage capacity of 233,000 acre-feet below elevation 1750 reduced by 50 years of sediment accumulation (133,000 acre-feet). Computations were made to distribute the sediment throughout the reservoir below elevation 1750 and adjust the area-capacity relationship for estimating the reservoir evaporation for the operation studies.

6. Reservoir Evaporation. Records of pan evaporation have been obtained at San Carlos Reservoir since August 1930. Average monthly evaporation rates for San Carlos Reservoir were estimated by application of a factor of 0.70 to the mean monthly pan evaporation for the 1930-1956 period. The average monthly precipitation obtained at San Carlos Reservoir for the 1930-1956 period was deducted from the adjusted evaporation for use in the reservoir operation studies.

San Carlos and Buttes Reservoirs are about the same latitude. A comparison of the climatological data for Dudleyville, Kelvin, and Florence and the evaporation data at Sacaton with that for San Carlos Reservoir indicates that the evaporation minus precipitation rates derived for San Carlos Reservoir are applicable for Buttes Reservoir in the reservoir operation studies.

7. Yield at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam. The yield attributable to the operation of Buttes Reservoir would be the increase in yield at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam for conditions with Buttes Reservoir compared with conditions without Buttes Reservoir based on comparable operating criteria.

a. Present Yield at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam. The records of diversions for irrigation at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam for the 1930-1956 period represent the actual yield of the present operation system for that period. Considering the releases at Coolidge Dam as the yield of San



Carlos Reservoir, the excess of diversions at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam over the San Carlos Reservoir releases for the 1930-1956 period would represent the yield from the unregulated inflow downstream from Coolidge Dam for that period. Recorded diversions for irrigation at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam averaged 194,730 acre-feet a year for the 1930-1956 period and the average annual discharge of the Gila River below Coolidge Dam for the period was 185,470 acre-feet. The apparent average annual yield from the unregulated inflow downstream from Coolidge Dam for the 1930-1956 period would be 194,730 acre-feet minus 185,470 acre-feet or 9,260 acre-feet.

The records of inflow, release, and storage at San Carlos Reservoir provided a basis for determining the monthly net gains or losses in the San Carlos Reservoir area for the 1930-1956 period exclusive of the estimated reservoir evaporation. These gains or losses on an annual basis with consideration for the estimated gain or loss in the reservoir area under natural conditions and estimated annual changes in reservoir bank storage permitted the derivation of estimates of the increased loss or salvage in the reservoir area resulting from San Carlos Reservoir operation. With recorded inflow to the reservoir computed as the sum of the flow of the Gila River at Calva and the San Carlos River near Peridot averaging 212,300 acre-feet a year, annual outflow below Coolidge Dam averaging 185,500 acre-feet, and a decrease in reservoir contents averaging 4,600 acre-feet a year, the apparent loss in the reservoir area averaged 31,400 acre-feet a year for the 1930-1956 period. As estimated in the Bureau of Reclamation November 1952 "Report on Water Supply of the Lower Colorado River Basin", change in bank storage in San Carlos Reservoir would average 14.6 percent of the change in surface contents of the



reservoir. With an average annual withdrawal of 4,600 acre-feet from the surface contents for the 1930-1956 period, the average annual withdrawal from reservoir bank storage would thus be 700 acre-feet. The total average annual loss in the reservoir would be 31,400 acre-feet plus 700 acre-feet or 32,100 acre-feet. The net evaporation loss estimated for the reservoir averaged 20,800 acre-feet a year. Based on studies for the November 1952 "Report on Water Supply of the Lower Colorado River Basin" and its November 1953 Memorandum Supplement, the annual net loss within the San Carlos Reservoir area for the 1930-1956 period under natural conditions would average 4,100 acre-feet. The estimated increased loss within the reservoir area resulting from reservoir operation for the 1930-1956 period exclusive of reservoir evaporation and bank storage thus averaged 32,100 acre-feet minus 20,800 acre-feet minus 4,100 acre-feet or 7,200 acre-feet a year.

b. Future Yield Without Buttes Reservoir. A monthly reservoir operation study was made for San Carlos Reservoir for the 1930-1956 period to provide a comparable basis to determine the yield attributable to Buttes Reservoir. Storage capacity of 960,000 acre-feet was used for San Carlos Reservoir to reflect the accumulation of an additional 50 years of sediment (250,000 acre-feet). The normal annual demand of 400,000 acre-feet at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam was supplied to the extent possible first from the yield from the unregulated inflow downstream from Coolidge Dam, next from natural flow water passed through Coolidge Dam, and then from releases of water stored in San Carlos Reservoir. Adjustments were made in the summary studies to correct for increased gains or losses in the reservoir area. As discussed in the section pertaining to the actual yield of the present operating system, it is estimated that the



net annual loss of stream flow within the San Carlos Reservoir area averaged 4,100 acre-feet under natural conditions for the 1930-1956 period. The reservoir operation for this study indicates an average annual decrease in reservoir contents of 2,800 acre-feet for the 1930-1956 period. With changes in reservoir bank storage estimated to average 14.6 percent of changes in surface contents of the reservoir, the estimated average annual withdrawal from bank storage would be 400 acre-feet. The estimated increased loss over natural conditions within the reservoir area for the 1930-1956 period of actual operation of the San Carlos Reservoir exclusive of reservoir evaporation and bank storage averaged 7,200 acre-feet a year with an average vacant reservoir area of 15,200 acres. The average vacant reservoir area for the period for this study was estimated to be 16,300 acres. Applying this vacant reservoir ratio of 1.072 to the 7,200 acre-feet loss under actual operating conditions derives an estimated average annual increased loss of 7,700 acre-feet for the period for this study. The estimated average annual adjustment to apply to the apparent release at Coolidge Dam would thus be the 4,100 acre-feet estimated loss within the reservoir area under natural conditions plus the increased average annual loss of 7,700 acre-feet minus the 400 acre-feet withdrawn from bank storage or an average annual loss of 11,400 acre-feet plus the average annual 2,800 acre-feet decrease in reservoir surface contents for the period or a total average annual adjustment of 14,200 acre-feet to be subtracted from the indicated release at Coolidge Dam for the 1930-1956 period.

Table 2 summarizes the reservoir operation studies on an annual basis and estimates the future yield of the system at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam without Buttes Reservoir would average 194,600 acre-feet annually for the 1930-1956 period.

c. Yield of System with Buttes Reservoir. Monthly coordinated reservoir operation studies for Buttes and San Carlos Reservoirs were made for the 1930-1956 period with conservation capacities of 100,000 and 960,000 acre-feet, respectively, and a normal annual demand of 400,000 acre-feet at Ashurst-Mayden Diversion Dam. The demand would be met to the extent possible first from normal flow at the Buttes site, next from natural flow water passed through Coolidge Dam, then from releases of water stored in Buttes Reservoir, and finally from releases from storage in San Carlos Reservoir. It was assumed that a minimum pool of 2,000 acre-feet (available contents) in Buttes Reservoir would be required in reregulating releases at Coolidge Dam and controlling sediment inflow. The minimum contents would be sufficient to provide recreation and fish and wildlife benefits. Adjustments were made in the summary studies to correct for increased gains or losses in the San Carlos Reservoir area. The actual records of the operation of the San Carlos Reservoir for the 1930-1956 period provided a basis for the adjustments needed in the operation studies. The method for determining the adjustments described in the section pertaining to the future yield of the system without Buttes Reservoir was also used to estimate the adjustments to apply to the yield of San Carlos Reservoir for this study. The average vacant area for San Carlos Reservoir for the 1930-1956 period for this study was estimated to be 14,800 acres. The estimated average annual adjustment to apply to the apparent yield of San Carlos Reservoir would be the 4,100 acre-feet estimated loss within the reservoir under natural conditions plus an estimated increased average annual loss of 7,000 acre-feet minus an estimated 600 acre-feet withdrawn from bank storage or an average annual loss of 10,500 acre-feet plus the average annual 4,300 acre-feet of decrease in reservoir



surface contents for the period or a total average annual adjustment of 14,800 acre-feet to be subtracted from the indicated yield of San Carlos Reservoir for the 1930-1956 period. Estimates of net losses in the Buttes Reservoir area in addition to reservoir evaporation would need to be based upon more or less arbitrary assumptions concerning (1) contributions from the drainage area between the stream gage at Kelvin and the Buttes Dam site, and (2) evaporation and growth of vegetation on exposed areas along the shore, river channel, and delta of the reservoir which would use water measured at the Kelvin gage. Because data were not available to provide a basis for making the estimates, no adjustments were made in the reservoir operation studies to allow for net losses in the Buttes Reservoir area in addition to reservoir evaporation. However, the records of the actual operation of San Carlos Reservoir indicate that a small adjustment should also be made to allow for additional losses in the Buttes Reservoir area.

Table 3 summarizes the coordinated reservoir operation studies on an annual basis and indicates that the future yield of the system at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam with Buttes Reservoir would average 247,300 acre-feet annually for the 1930-1956 period.

d. Yield Attributable to Buttes Reservoir. The yield at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam attributable to Buttes Reservoir would be the yield estimated for conditions with Buttes Reservoir minus the estimated yield for conditions without Buttes Reservoir. The average annual yield of surface water attributable to Buttes Reservoir would thus be 247,300 acre-feet minus 194,600 acre-feet or 52,700 acre-feet for the 1930-1956 period as indicated by the reservoir operation studies. The average annual yield indicated by the reservoir operation studies to be

attributable to Buttes Reservoir was rounded to 50,000 acre-feet to allow for net losses in the Buttes Reservoir area in addition to reservoir evaporation, small increases in upstream depletions which were not reflected in the 1930-1956 historical measurements of reservoir inflow, and other minor contingencies.

In the event that future developments such as Charleston Dam would be constructed on the upper San Pedro River to furnish municipal and domestic water for the City of Tucson, Arizona, the increased uses would decrease the inflow and consequently the average annual yield attributable to Buttes Reservoir. However, much of the water now passing the Charleston Dam site is lost in the channel of the San Pedro River before reaching the Gila River and diversions from the river at the Charleston site would not deplete inflow to Buttes Reservoir by a like amount. It had been estimated in connection with the Central Arizona Project studies that the construction of Charleston Dam would conserve at least 7,000 acre-feet a year by impounding low flows that would otherwise be lost in the channel and permit them to be diverted for beneficial consumptive use. Thus, increased depletions of 7,000 acre-feet a year at the Charleston site could be permitted without decreasing inflow to Buttes Reservoir but annual depletions in excess of 7,000 acre-feet would reduce the estimated yield attributable to Buttes Reservoir.

8. Effects of Buttes Reservoir Operation on Downstream Ground-Water Supply. The ground-water supply of the area is available to not only the San Carlos Project wells but also to wells off the project and the estimated quantities available for pumping would be based on the available quantities in ground-water storage with consideration of the recharge to the underground reservoir from the various sources. The main sources of



recharge to the ground-water reservoir of the Casa Grande-Florence-Sacaton area are seepage from surface water flows in the Gila River channel in the area and seepage from waters diverted and pumped for irrigation. It appears appropriate that estimates of recharge from these main sources would be based on the longest period for which stream flow records are available. The 1915-1956 period was selected to provide estimates considered representative of average recharge conditions. Other possible sources of recharge are precipitation on the area, underflow to the area, and water rising from depth along fault zones. The small quantity of recharge from the low precipitation on the area was considered negligible and would be the same with or without Buttes Reservoir in operation. The quantity rising from depth along fault zones would also be the same with or without Buttes Reservoir and as it is probably small, it was also considered negligible. There is some movement of ground water into and out of the area. The operation of Buttes Reservoir would decrease the flow in the Gila River through the area and thus decrease the recharge resulting from seepage from the channel of the Gila River. However, diversions for irrigation would be increased with Buttes Reservoir in operation and recharge resulting from seepage of diverted water would be increased.

a. Recharge from Underflow. The Geological Survey has made some estimates of underflow entering and leaving the Casa Grande-Florence-Sacaton area. The underflow entering the area at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam is estimated to be 2,500 acre-feet a year. With Buttes Dam and Supply Canal constructed, the underflow at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam would probably be negligible. The underflow from McClellan Wash in the southeastern part of the area is estimated to be 2,000 acre-feet a year. Buttes



Reservoir would have no effect on this underflow. There is now very little movement of ground water into the area from the south or out of the area to the west and these inflows and outflows of ground water were considered to be in balance. The effects of inflows and outflows of ground water in the north and northwest portions of the area on the recharge to the area were considered to be in balance.

b. Recharge from Gila River Seepage. Correlation of the discharge records obtained for the Gila River at Kelvin, at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam, and near Laveen considering records of diversions at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam, Sacaton Dam, and in the Cooperative Canal near Laveen provided methods for estimating the average annual losses of stream flow in these river sections without Buttes Reservoir and losses from spills with Buttes Reservoir. It appears reasonable to estimate that 50 percent of the net losses of stream flow in the river reach would percolate to the ground-water reservoir.

It was estimated that the average annual net loss in the Gila River between Kelvin and the gage near Laveen for the 1915-1956 period without Buttes Reservoir would be 50,500 acre-feet. With 50 percent of the net losses percolating to the ground-water reservoir, the average annual recharge to the Casa Grande-Florence-Sacaton area without Buttes Reservoir would be 25,200 acre-feet. With Buttes Reservoir in operation the average annual net losses from spills for the 1915-1956 period were estimated to be 12,000 acre-feet and the recharge to the ground-water reservoir would average 6,000 acre-feet a year.

c. Recharge from Surface Water Diverted for Irrigation. Records of diversions at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam and farm deliveries to the San Carlos Project and general irrigating practices in the area indicate



that it appears reasonable to estimate that 30 percent of the surface water diverted for irrigation would recharge the Casa Grande-Florence-Sacaton ground-water basin. It is estimated that without Buttes Reservoir, the average annual diversion of surface water for irrigation for the 1915-1956 period would be 236,700 acre-feet. The average annual recharge to the ground-water basin without Buttes Reservoir would be 30 percent of 236,700 acre-feet or 71,000 acre-feet. With Buttes Reservoir, the average annual diversion of surface water for irrigation for the 1915-1956 period would be increased 50,000 acre-feet. The additional average annual recharge to the ground-water basin with Buttes Reservoir in operation would be 30 percent of 50,000 acre-feet or 15,000 acre-feet, making a total annual recharge of 71,000 acre-feet plus 15,000 acre-feet or 86,000 acre-feet.

With Buttes Reservoir in operation, it was estimated that average annual diversions of 13,600 acre-feet for the 1915-1956 period would be made at Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam in excess of the irrigation requirements and spread on project lands to recharge the ground-water basin during periods when water would be spilling at Buttes Dam. Some of the water would be lost by evaporation and transpiration and it is estimated that two-thirds of the water diverted in excess of irrigation requirements would recharge the ground-water basin. The average annual recharge from diversions in excess of irrigation requirements with Buttes Reservoir in operation would be two-thirds of 13,600 acre-feet or 9,100 acre-feet. These excess diversions would not be made without Buttes Reservoir because of the sediment load.

d. Summary of Recharge from Surface Water Supply. The total estimated average annual recharge to the Casa Grande-Florence-Sacaton area



from ground-water underflow, seepage from the Gila River in the area, and diversions of surface water is summarized in Table 4 for conditions without Buttes Reservoir and for conditions with Buttes Reservoir in operation. The studies demonstrated that the recharge to the ground-water basin with Buttes Reservoir in operation would be slightly greater than for conditions without Buttes Reservoir. However, because of the many assumptions involved in the recharge studies, the estimated average annual recharge was rounded to 100,000 acre-feet for conditions both without and with Buttes Reservoir in operation.

e. Recharge from Water Pumped for Irrigation. Water pumped from San Carlos Project wells enters the canals and laterals of the distribution system at the location of the well and is mingled with the surface water throughout the system. The recharge to the ground-water basin was assumed to be the same as for the surface water diverted for irrigation or 30 percent of the water pumped from project wells. Water is pumped from nonproject wells directly to the farm distribution system with resulting high irrigation efficiency. It is estimated that 10 percent of the water pumped from nonproject wells would recharge the ground-water reservoir.

f. Ground Water Available for Pumping. It is assumed that pumping for the present development in the Casa Grande-Florence-Sacaton area would be continued until it would be limited to the annual recharge. It was assumed that the demand of the San Carlos Project for pumped water would be 20 percent of the total annual demand or 100,000 acre-feet a year. The average annual pumping of about 210,000 acre-feet for the 1946-1958 period from nonproject wells appears indicative of the requirements of the present development in the area outside the San Carlos Project. The annual

recharge from the pumped water would be 30 percent of the 100,000 acre-feet pumped by the San Carlos Project plus 10 percent of the 210,000 acre-feet from nonproject wells or a total annual recharge of 51,000 acre-feet. The average annual recharge from surface water was estimated to be 100,000 acre-feet. Thus the total annual recharge to the ground-water basin of the area as long as average annual pumping of 310,000 acre-feet is



maintained would be 151,000 acre-feet and the average annual depletion of the stored ground water in the area would be 159,000 acre-feet. Based on logs of wells, estimates of the average depth of the aquifer from which wells are now pumping in the area, and pumping experience in the area, it is estimated that pumping at the annual rate of 310,000 acre-feet could be maintained for 25 years. Pumping would then be limited to the annual recharge. The recharge from surface water would be available only to pumps within the San Carlos Project and a limited area outside the boundaries of the project. Based on past pumping experience in the area, it is estimated that 42 percent of the average annual recharge would be available to San Carlos Project wells and 58 percent to nonproject wells.

Table 5 summarizes the ground water available for pumping from San Carlos Project wells when pumping would be limited to the annual recharge. The table indicates that 50,000 acre-feet would be available annually to the San Carlos Project wells.

It was estimated that pumping at the annual rate of 100,000 acre-feet could be maintained by the San Carlos Project wells for 25 years and then pumping would be limited to 50,000 acre-feet annually. On this basis the average annual ground water available for the San Carlos Project wells would be 75,000 acre-feet for 50 years and 62,500 acre-feet for 100 years.

9. Summary of Potential Water Supply for San Carlos Project. The average annual total water supply for the San Carlos Project for 50 years and for 100 years with and without Buttes Reservoir is shown in Table 6.

The increase in total water supply for the San Carlos Project attributable to the operation of Buttes Reservoir would be 50,000 acre-feet a year.

STATEMENT TO ACCOMPANY SECTIONS 18 AND 19
OF APPLICATION TO APPROPRIATE WATER FOR
BUTTES DAM RESERVOIR

The Buckeye Irrigation Company and the Arlington Canal Company, have, in the past, made claim to waters of the Gila River system which includes some of the waters that it is intended will be impounded by the proposed Buttes Dam. The United States, however, has secured a release and waiver for all damages which might arise from actions that might interfere with any rights that the Buckeye Irrigation Company or Arlington Canal Company may have in the flow of the Gila River. Contracts with these companies entered into pursuant to Act of Congress (59 Stat. 318, 330), copies of which are attached hereto, specifically granted a waiver of future damages that these companies might sustain by reason of the United States constructing any new works on the Gila River, upstream from the Sacaton Diversion Dam, to impound or divert waters to which these companies may be entitled. The Buttes Dam will be located upstream from the Sacaton Diversion Dam. See particularly sections 26, 30, 31, and 35 of the above-mentioned agreements.

The United States owns the right to divert water from the Gila River for the irrigation of 2992.5 acres of land located within the Gila River Indian Reservation in the Gila Crossing District. These rights are downstream from the proposed Buttes Dam. The Gila Decree, however, specifically subordinates these rights to those of the San Carlos Irrigation Project, and further provides, among other things, that the San Carlos Irrigation Project may divert and use water otherwise occurring in the river above the points of diversion for the Gila Crossing District lands. See Article VI (6) of the decree in the case of United States v. Gila Valley Irrigation District, et al.





STATEMENT TO ACCOMPANY SECTIONS 18 AND 19
OF APPLICATION TO APPROPRIATE WATER FOR
BUTTES DAM RESERVOIR

The Buckeye Irrigation Company and the Arlington Canal Company, have, in the past, made claim to waters of the Gila River system which includes some of the waters that it is intended will be impounded by the proposed Buttes Dam. The United States, however, has secured a release and waiver for all damages which might arise from actions that might interfere with any rights that the Buckeye Irrigation Company or Arlington Canal Company may have in the flow of the Gila River. Contracts with these companies entered into pursuant to Act of Congress (59 Stat. 318, 330), copies of which are attached hereto, specifically granted a waiver of future damages that these companies might sustain by reason of the United States constructing any new works on the Gila River, upstream from the Sacaton Diversion Dam, to impound or divert waters to which these companies may be entitled. The Buttes Dam will be located upstream from the Sacaton Diversion Dam. See particularly sections 26, 30, 31, and 35 of the above-mentioned agreements.

The United States owns the right to divert water from the Gila River for the irrigation of 2992.5 acres of land located within the Gila River Indian Reservation in the Gila Crossing District. These rights are downstream from the proposed Buttes Dam. The Gila Decree, however, specifically subordinates these rights to those of the San Carlos Irrigation Project, and further provides, among other things, that the San Carlos Irrigation Project may divert and use water otherwise occurring in the river above the points of diversion for the Gila Crossing District lands. See Article VI (6) of the decree in the case of United States v. Gila Valley Irrigation District, et al.







STATEMENT TO ACCOMPANY SECTIONS 18 AND 19
OF APPLICATION TO APPROPRIATE WATER FOR
BUTTES DAM RESERVOIR

The Buckeye Irrigation Company and the Arlington Canal Company, have, in the past, made claim to waters of the Gila River system which includes some of the waters that it is intended will be impounded by the proposed Buttes Dam. The United States, however, has secured a release and waiver for all damages which might arise from actions that might interfere with any rights that the Buckeye Irrigation Company or Arlington Canal Company may have in the flow of the Gila River. Contracts with these companies entered into pursuant to Act of Congress (59 Stat. 318, 330), copies of which are attached hereto, specifically granted a waiver of future damages that these companies might sustain by reason of the United States constructing any new works on the Gila River, upstream from the Sacaton Diversion Dam, to impound or divert waters to which these companies may be entitled. The Buttes Dam will be located upstream from the Sacaton Diversion Dam. See particularly sections 26, 30, 31, and 35 of the above-mentioned agreements.

The United States owns the right to divert water from the Gila River for the irrigation of 2992.5 acres of land located within the Gila River Indian Reservation in the Gila Crossing District. These rights are downstream from the proposed Buttes Dam. The Gila Decree, however, specifically subordinates these rights to those of the San Carlos Irrigation Project, and further provides, among other things, that the San Carlos Irrigation Project may divert and use water otherwise occurring in the river above the points of diversion for the Gila Crossing District lands. See Article VI (6) of the decree in the case of United States v. Gila Valley Irrigation District, et al.

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

SAN CARLOS FEDERAL IRRIGATION PROJECT

and

ARLINGTON CANAL COMPANY

1. THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 29th day of May, ~~Nineteen hundred Forty-five (1945)~~, 1947, pursuant to authority of the Acts of Congress approved May 18, 1916 (39 Stat. 123-130), June 7, 1924 (43 Stat. 475) and March 7, 1928 (45 Stat. 200) and Acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, particularly the Act of July 3, 1945 (Public No. 123-79th Cong., 1st Sess. at page 14), by and between the United States of America, acting herein by the Secretary of the Interior, hereinafter referred to as the United States, and Arlington Canal Company, an Arizona corporation, hereinafter referred to as the Company.

WITNESSETH THAT:

EXPLANATORY RECITALS

2. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and now owns the Florence-Casa Grande Irrigation Project, originally comprising approximately 62,000 acres of land, 35,000 acres of which were in the Gila River Indian Reservation, Arizona and the remaining 27,000 acres were and now are owned by non-Indians located upstream and just east of said reservation; and

3. WHEREAS, the United States owns and holds in trust all the water rights for said Florence-Casa Grande Project; and

4. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and now owns and operates the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project, Arizona; and

(Recorded in Pinal County, Arizona, on September 29, 1947, in Book 7 of Contracts and Agreements, Page 564)

5. WHEREAS, said San Carlos Project now embraces 100,546 acres of land, 50,000 acres of which are within the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, a public corporation, and 50,546 acres are located within the Gila River Indian Reservation; and

6. WHEREAS, all but approximately 1,545 acres of said Florence-Casa Grande Project lands were merged with and are included in the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project; and

7. WHEREAS, the United States owns and holds in trust all the water rights for the San Carlos Project lands including the water rights for the Florence-Casa Grande Project lands which have been merged with the San Carlos Project as aforesaid; and

8. WHEREAS, said water rights are all defined and described in detail in a decree of the United States District Court for Arizona, entered June 29, 1935, in the case of United States of America vs. Gila Valley Irrigation District, et al., the original of which is on file in the office of the Clerk of said Court and a copy thereof is also on file in the San Carlos Project office at Coolidge, Arizona; and

9. WHEREAS, the United States rights to use the waters of the Gila River for the irrigation of lands in said projects are (1) direct diversion rights, the earliest of which has an immemorial date of priority, (2) storage rights with a priority of not later than June 7, 1924, and (3) underground rights including the right to pump from the subsurface flow of the Gila River at any and all points between the San Carlos Project Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam and the western boundary of the said San Carlos Irrigation Project; and

10. WHEREAS, the United States also owns the right to divert and use water from the Gila River for the irrigation of 2992.5 acres of Indian land at the "Gila Crossing District" on the Gila River Reservation all of which have been irrigated and are now under Government owned canals which now divert water from the Gila River at points, about 13 and 17 miles respectively, east of and upstream from the place where the Salt River empties into the Gila River, all as provided for in said Federal Court Decree; and

11. WHEREAS, the United States also owns and holds in trust for Indians of the Gila Reservation 4465.505 acres of land comprising the "Lone Butte" farm containing 1989.62 acres, the "Broadacres Ranch" containing 1739.57 acres, the "Collier" lease farm containing 486.02 acres and the "Cheatham" lease farm containing 250.295 acres, which have been and now are being irrigated with water pumped from wells and "Tempe Drain" water, the right to the use of which it also owns; and

12. WHEREAS, the Company is willing to waive any claim of past, present or future damages on account of past, present or future irrigation of the areas last aforesaid; and

13. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and owns and operates the Coolidge Dam and San Carlos Reservoir, the construction of which was sufficiently complete to allow the storage of water therein beginning November 15, 1928; and

14. WHEREAS, the Arlington Canal Company owns and operates a diversion dam and other intake structures and canals on the Gila River downstream from the Buckeye Irrigation Company's diversion dam which said irrigation facilities have been used by the Company to furnish irrigation water to and for its landowner stockholders; and

15. WHEREAS, the Company's landowners all own or claim to own a water right evidenced by one share of Company stock for each one hundred and sixty acre tract of land or part of one share of Company stock in each case where a Company landowner has less than one hundred and sixty acres of irrigable land under said Company irrigation system; and

16. WHEREAS, said Company diverts and uses water from the Gila River below the mouth of the Salt River at a point near or below the lower boundary of the Buckeye Irrigation Company project; and

17. WHEREAS, the Company has used water pumped from lands in or adjacent to the Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District to provide a substitute water supply for the losses it claims its landowners have suffered by reason of the construction of reservoirs on the Salt and Verde Rivers and by reason of increased pumping within the Project of the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association and the Roosevelt Irrigation District and other irrigation developments thereon and on the Agua Fria and elsewhere above the

Arlington Canal Company's diversion dam and/or other intake facilities; and

18. WHEREAS, the Company representing all the land-owners who receive water from or claim the right to use water from the Gila River through the facilities of the Arlington Canal Company system filed, as co-plaintiff with the Buckeye Irrigation Company, a suit in the Superior Court of Maricopa County, Arizona, against the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association, a corporation, and others in September, 1929, alleging among other things that the construction of reservoirs and other irrigation structures on the Salt River together with large scale pumping by the Association and the Roosevelt Irrigation District, also a defendant in said suit, had interfered with and diminished the supply of water theretofore available at the Company's diversion dam and other intake structures; and

19. WHEREAS, the Company also alleged that the construction of the Coolidge Dam and Reservoir by the United States and its use of stored water on the San Carlos Irrigation Project together with an alleged increased use of San Pedro water by said project had also interfered with and diminished the water supply of the Company and in an effort to curtail said alleged increased uses, the Company named as defendants the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, the San Carlos Project Engineer, the Superintendent of the Gila River Indian Reservation and numerous individual Indians of that Reservation; but the Company did not and does not now assert any claim to water rights adverse to the Indians of the San Carlos Reservation all of whose points of diversion are above Coolidge Dam; and

20. WHEREAS, the United States Attorney for Arizona appeared specially on behalf of the Project Engineer, the Superintendent and the individual Pima Indians for the purpose of questioning the jurisdiction of the Court and made formal suggestions to the Court that the suit was in effect one against the United States, since it owned all project water rights and the Coolidge Dam and the project diversion dams and all the other project works and that therefore the Court had no jurisdiction over the subject matter of said suit; and

21. WHEREAS, thereafter the Company indicated its willingness to confer with all parties concerned for the purpose of working out a satisfactory settlement of the entire controversy; and

22. WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Interior thereafter appointed the Honorable Clifford H. Stone of Denver, Colorado, as Mediator who conducted mediation proceedings over a period of several years and worked with the various parties in an effort to assist the Company in reaching a mutually satisfactory settlement of its grievances with each of the other projects which the Company claimed had interfered with its water supply; and

23. WHEREAS, the Company has made satisfactory settlements with all of said other projects and companies; and

24. WHEREAS, although the United States has contended that its water rights were superior to those of the Company and its landowners, the San Carlos Irrigation Project representatives have conceded that future construction of additional works contemplated by the United States to make a more effective use of its irrigation system and water physically available for the San Carlos Irrigation Project might diminish the amount of water in the Gila River at a point 100 feet above the mouth of the Salt River and thereby invade the rights of the Company; and

25. WHEREAS, the Company by reason of the diminishing of its water supply has claimed as set forth in paragraphs 17, 18 and 19 hereof that it has been compelled to furnish its landowners some well water and in order to furnish a substitute supply to offset the aforesaid losses and protect its landowners against losses which may result from the aforesaid increased future uses by the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project the Company believes it will have to drill at least one well, install one pump, and operate the same as a means of obtaining part of its permanent water supply hereafter; and

26. WHEREAS, the United States, in order to reconcile its differences with the Company and settle all past disputes and avoid future controversy with the Company over the right of the United States to control and use the waters of the Gila River and its tributaries above the mouth of the Salt River, is willing to pay the Company for a release of its past, present and future claims against the United States on account of the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project as now constituted or as it may hereafter be improved by the construction of new dams, (such as the "Buttes") reservoirs or other facilities to make Gila River water more completely available to said project and the other lands hereinbefore mentioned, located at Gila Crossing, also the Florence-Casa

Grande Project lands not included in said San Carlos Project; and

27. WHEREAS, in view of the satisfactory arrangements the Company has made with the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association and other users on the Salt River and its tributaries the Company is willing to dismiss its suit with prejudice as to the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, San Carlos Project officials, Superintendent A. E. Robinson and all of the Pima and/or Maricopa Indians and waive all claims to the use of water from the Gila River at and above Gila Crossing in the future upon receipt of the sum of money hereinafter provided for and upon the terms and conditions set forth in this agreement.

28. NOW, THEREFORE, in order to adjust and settle the existing controversy, promote the welfare of the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project, avoid future controversies, and in consideration of the premises and the covenants hereinafter contained and the payment by the United States to the Company the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) as hereinafter provided it is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

29. The United States shall pay the Company for and on behalf of its stockholders the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) in accordance with Government fiscal regulations upon the occurrence of the following events:

- (1) The approval of this agreement by appropriate and satisfactory resolutions duly and regularly adopted by:
 - a. The stockholders of the Arlington Canal Company, a corporation,
 - b. The San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District and
 - c. The Gila River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Council.
- (2) The filing of a motion to dismiss by the Arlington Canal Company with the Clerk of the Superior Court of Maricopa County, Arizona, and the entry of a due and regular court order based thereon, dismissing with prejudice both as to the Company and its stockholders and all landowners, represented

by it, the Company's suit against the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, Project Engineer C. J. Moody, and Superintendent A. E. Robinson in their official and individual capacities and each of the Pima and/or other Indians named in said suit.

- (3) Availability of the funds appropriated by Congress in the aforesaid Act of July 3, 1945.
- (4) The due and regular execution of this agreement by the parties hereto.

30. The Company acknowledges the receipt of said sum of \$10,000.00 and hereby fully and in all respects releases the United States, the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, and the Pima Indians from all damages or claims of damage by reason of past, present or future operation and use of Coolidge Dam and the storage of Gila River water in the San Carlos Reservoir, for the past, present or future diversions of water at Ashurst-Hayden and Sacaton Diversion Dams, also on account of the construction of any new storage and/or diversion dams on the Gila or its tributaries above the Sacaton Bridge and Diversion Dam and/or the storage of water therein or diversions therefrom, and for past, present or future diversions at Gila Crossing for the irrigation of the hereinbefore mentioned 2992.5 acres of Indian lands, PROVIDED, that the construction of new reservoirs or other storage works that may be built by the United States or its assigns to store and divert additional quantities of Gila River waters together with existing reservoirs and other works shall not be used for the purpose of irrigating more than 100,546 acres of San Carlos Irrigation Project lands plus 1545 acres of Florence-Casa Grande Project lands not in the San Carlos Project and said 2992.5 acres of non-project Indian lands under the Gila Crossing irrigation system.

31. Subject to the foregoing limitation the United States and/or its assigns may build for the San Carlos Irrigation Project such other storage and diversion dams on the Gila or any of its tributaries at any point or points it may choose upstream from Sacaton Bridge and Diversion Dam. It is further agreed that subject to the same limitation the United States may drill such new wells and install pumps therein as it may deem necessary to more

fully utilize its water rights enumerated in paragraph 9 hereof.

32. It is mutually understood that the acreage limitations enumerated in paragraph 30 hereof shall not be construed as applying to or in any way limiting the acreage which the United States may irrigate through the use of any or all of said storage and/or diversion dams to the extent that it may use them to store, release and/or divert water that may be brought into the channel of the Gila River from some other stream or streams not tributary thereto.

33. The Company hereby releases the United States and the Pima Indians from all damages or claims of damage by reason of past, present or future irrigation of the hereinbefore described "Lone Butte" farm, the "Broadacres Ranch", the "Collier" lease farm and the "Cheatham" lease farm, and hereby agrees that this agreement shall be construed as including the consent of the Company for the Indians of the Gila Reservation, or the United States for them, to continue the irrigation of the aforesaid farms with water obtained in the manner aforesaid or by the drilling of new wells from time to time for the purpose of obtaining an adequate water supply to irrigate all or any of said four farm areas, and that irrespective of whether said lands shall be farmed and irrigated by the Indians or their lessees, the motion to dismiss and order of dismissal provided for in 29(2) hereof shall be deemed to bind the Company as to the farm areas and the irrigation thereof as described herein and in paragraphs 11 and 12.

34. It is mutually understood and agreed that this agreement shall not be construed as affecting or in any way limiting rights of the Maricopa Indians to the use of water from Salt River, which rights were determined, defined and described in the decree of the Federal Court for the District of Arizona in the case of United States of America vs. N. W. Haggard et al., neither shall it be construed as in any way affecting or limiting the rights of the United States or its Indian wards to use water from the Salt River and tributaries for the irrigation of Indian lands on the Salt River and Fort McDowell Indian Reservations.

35. The Company hereby agrees that its release to the United States, as set forth in paragraphs 30 and 31 hereof,

shall be construed as a waiver of any and all claims against the Indians of the San Carlos Indian Reservation and the Company does hereby disclaim any right or rights to the use of the Gila River water or its tributaries as against the Indians of said reservation.

36. No Member of, or Delegate to Congress, or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract, or to any benefit that may arise therefrom, but this restriction shall not be construed to extend to this contract if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

37. It is intended that the terms and provisions of this contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the United States and its assigns, the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, its successors or assigns, also the Gila River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community, and the Company, its successors and assigns and all its stockholders and landowner water users and their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.



ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

1. THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 29th day of May, Nineteen hundred Forty-five (1947), pursuant to authority of the Acts of Congress approved May 18, 1916 (39 Stat. 123-130), June 7, 1924 (43 Stat. 475) and March 7, 1928 (45 Stat. 200) and Acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, particularly the Act of July 3, 1945 (Public No. 123-79th Cong., 1st Sess. at page 14), by and between the United States of America, acting herein by the Secretary of the Interior, hereinafter referred to as the United States, and Buckeye Irrigation Company, an Arizona corporation, hereinafter referred to as the Company.

WITNESSETH THAT:

EXPLANATORY RECITALS

2. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and now owns the Florence-Casa Grande Irrigation Project, originally comprising approximately 62,000 acres of land, 35,000 acres of which were in the Gila River Indian Reservation, Arizona and the remaining 27,000 acres were and now are owned by non-Indians located upstream and just east of said reservation; and

3. WHEREAS, the United States owns and holds in trust all the water rights for said Florence-Casa Grande Project; and

4. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and now owns and operates the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project, Arizona; and

5. WHEREAS, said San Carlos Project now embraces 100,546 acres of land, 50,000 acres of which are within the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, a public corporation, and 50,546 acres are located within the Gila River Indian Reservation; and

(Recorded in Pinal County, Arizona, on September 29, 1947, in Book 7 of Contracts and Agreements, Page 570)

6. WHEREAS, all but approximately 1,545 acres of said Florence-Casa Grande Project lands were merged with and are included in the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project; and

7. WHEREAS, the United States owns and holds in trust all the water rights for the San Carlos Project lands including the water rights for the Florence-Casa Grande Project lands which have been merged with the San Carlos Project as aforesaid; and

8. WHEREAS, said water rights are all defined and described in detail in a decree of the United States District Court for Arizona, entered June 29, 1935, in the case of United States of America vs. Gila Valley Irrigation District, et al., the original of which is on file in the office of the Clerk of said Court and a copy thereof is also on file in the San Carlos Project office at Coolidge, Arizona; and

9. WHEREAS, the United States rights to use the waters of the Gila River for the irrigation of lands in said projects are (1) direct diversion rights, the earliest of which has an immemorial date of priority, (2) storage rights with a priority of not later than June 7, 1924, and (3) underground rights including the right to pump from the subsurface flow of the Gila River at any and all points between the San Carlos Project Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam and the western boundary of the said San Carlos Irrigation Project; and

10. WHEREAS, the United States also owns the right to divert and use water from the Gila River for the irrigation of 2992.5 acres of Indian land at the "Gila Crossing District" on the Gila River Reservation all of which have been irrigated and are now under Government owned canals which now divert water from the Gila River at points, about 13 and 17 miles respectively, east of and upstream from the place where the Salt River empties into the Gila River, all as provided for in said Federal Court Decree; and

11. WHEREAS, the United States also owns and holds in trust for Indians of the Gila Reservation 4465.505 acres of land comprising the "Lone Butte" farm containing 1989.62 acres, the "Broadacres Ranch" containing 1739.57 acres, the "Collier" lease farm containing 486.02 acres and the "Cheatham" lease farm containing 250.295 acres, which have been and now are being irrigated with water pumped from wells and "Tempe Drain" water, the right to the use of which

it also owns; and

12. WHEREAS, the Company is willing to waive any claim of past, present or future damages on account of past, present or future irrigation of the areas last aforesaid; and

13. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and owns and operates the Coolidge Dam and San Carlos Reservoir, the construction of which was sufficiently complete to allow the storage of water therein beginning November 15, 1928; and

14. WHEREAS, the Buckeye Irrigation Company owns and operates a diversion dam and canals near Buckeye, Arizona, which said irrigation facilities together with wells and pumps are and have been used by the Company to furnish irrigation water for landowners in the Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District; and

15. WHEREAS, each landowner in said District who owns or claims to own a water right also owns one share of Company stock for each acre of land; and

16. WHEREAS, said Buckeye Company diverts and uses water from the Gila River below the mouth of the Salt River; and

17. WHEREAS, the Company has pumped water from lands in said District to provide a substitute water supply for water losses which it claims to have suffered by reason of the construction of reservoirs on the Salt and Verde Rivers and by reason of increased pumping within the project of the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association and the Roosevelt Irrigation District, and other irrigation developments on the Agua Fria and elsewhere above the Company diversion structures; and

18. WHEREAS, the Company representing all the landowners in said Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District filed a suit in the Superior Court of Maricopa County, Arizona, against the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association, a corporation, and others in September, 1929, alleging among other things that the construction of reservoirs and other irrigation structures on the Salt River together with large scale pumping by the Association and the Roosevelt Irrigation District, also a defendant in said suit, had interfered with and diminished the supply of water theretofore available at the Company's diversion dam; and

19. WHEREAS, the Company also alleged that the construction of the Coolidge Dam and Reservoir by the United States and its use of stored water on the San Carlos Irrigation Project together with an alleged increased use of San Pedro water by said project had also interfered with and diminished the water supply of the Company and in an effort to curtail said alleged increased uses, the Company named as defendants the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, the San Carlos Project Engineer, the Superintendent of the Gila River Indian Reservation and numerous individual Indians of that Reservation; but the Company did not and does not now assert any claim to water rights adverse to the Indians of the San Carlos Reservation all of whose points of diversion are above Coolidge Dam; and

20. WHEREAS, the United States Attorney for Arizona appeared specially on behalf of the Project Engineer, the Superintendent and the individual Pima Indians for the purpose of questioning the jurisdiction of the Court and made formal suggestions to the Court that the suit was in effect one against the United States, since it owned all project water rights and the Coolidge Dam and the project diversion dams and all the other project works, and that therefore the Court had no jurisdiction over the subject matter of said suit; and

21. WHEREAS, thereafter the Company indicated its willingness to confer with all parties concerned for the purpose of working out a satisfactory settlement of the entire controversy and to that end suggested that the Secretary of the Interior could facilitate a settlement of all the matters by appointing a disinterested person to act as mediator; and

22. WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Interior thereafter appointed the Honorable Clifford H. Stone of Denver, Colorado, as Mediator who conducted mediation proceedings over a period of several years and worked with the various parties in an effort to assist the Company in reaching a mutually satisfactory settlement of its grievances with each of the other projects which the Company claimed had interfered with its water supply; and

23. WHEREAS, the Company has made satisfactory settlements with all of said other projects and companies; and

24. WHEREAS, although the United States has contended that its water rights were superior to those of the Company

and its landowners, the San Carlos Irrigation Project representatives have conceded that future construction of additional works contemplated by the United States to make a more effective use of its irrigation system and water physically available for the San Carlos Irrigation Project might diminish the amount of water in the Gila River at a point 100 feet above the mouth of the Salt River and thereby invade the rights of the Company; and

25. WHEREAS, the Company by reason of the diminishing of its water supply as set forth in paragraphs 17, 18 and 19 hereof has been compelled to borrow money with which to drill wells and install pumps to furnish a substitute water supply to partially offset said losses and provide against the aforesaid future increased uses by the San Carlos Project; and

26. WHEREAS, the United States, in order to reconcile its differences with the Company and settle all past disputes and avoid future controversy with the Company over the right of the United States to control and use the waters of the Gila River and its tributaries above the mouth of the Salt River, is willing to pay the Company for a release of its past, present and future claims against the United States on account of the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project as now constituted or as it may hereafter be improved by the construction of new dams, (such as the "Buttes") reservoirs or other facilities to make Gila River water more completely available to said project and the other lands hereinbefore mentioned, located at Gila Crossing, also the Florence-Casa Grande Project lands not included in said San Carlos Project; and

27. WHEREAS, in view of the satisfactory arrangements the Company has made with the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association and other users on the Salt River and its tributaries the Company is willing to dismiss its suit with prejudice as to the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, San Carlos Project officials, Superintendent A. E. Robinson and all of the Pima and/or Maricopa Indians and waive all claims to the use of water from the Gila River at and above Gila Crossing in the future upon receipt of the sum of money hereinafter provided for and upon the terms and conditions set forth in this agreement.

28. NOW, THEREFORE, in order to adjust and settle the existing controversy, promote the welfare of the San Carlos

Federal Irrigation Project, avoid future controversies, and in consideration of the premises and the covenants hereinafter contained and the payment by the United States to the Company the sum of One Hundred Four Thousand, Four Hundred Dollars (\$104,400.00) as hereinafter provided it is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

29. The United States shall pay the Company for and on behalf of its stockholders the sum of One Hundred Four Thousand, Four Hundred Dollars (\$104,400.00) in accordance with Government fiscal regulations upon the occurrence of the following events:

- (1) The approval of this agreement by appropriate and satisfactory resolutions duly and regularly adopted by:
 - a. The stockholders of the Buckeye Irrigation Company, a corporation,
 - b. The Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District,
 - c. The San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District and
 - d. The Gila River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Council.
- (2) The filing of a motion to dismiss by the Buckeye Irrigation Company with the Clerk of the Superior Court of Maricopa County, Arizona, and the entry of a due and regular court order based thereon, dismissing with prejudice both as to the Company and the landowners within the Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District, the Company's suit against the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, Project Engineer C. J. Moody, and Superintendent A. E. Robinson in their official and individual capacities and each of the Pima and/or other Indians named in said suit.
- (3) Availability of the funds appropriated by Congress in the aforesaid Act of July 3, 1945.
- (4) The due and regular execution of this agreement by the parties hereto.

30. The Company acknowledges the receipt of said sum of \$104,400.00 and hereby fully and in all respects releases the United States, the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, and the Pima Indians from all damages or claims of damage by reason of past, present or future operation and use of Coolidge Dam and the storage of Gila River water in the San Carlos Reservoir, for the past, present or future diversions of water at Ashurst-Hayden and Sacaton Diversion Dams, also on account of the construction of any new storage and/or diversion dams on the Gila or its tributaries above the Sacaton Bridge and Diversion Dam and/or the storage of water therein or diversions therefrom, and for past, present or future diversions at Gila Crossing for the irrigation of the hereinbefore mentioned 2992.5 acres of Indian lands, PROVIDED, that the construction of new reservoirs or other storage works that may be built by the United States or its assigns to store and divert additional quantities of Gila River waters together with existing reservoirs and other works shall not be used for the purpose of irrigating more than 100,546 acres of San Carlos Irrigation Project lands plus 1545 acres of Florence-Casa Grande Project lands not in the San Carlos Project and said 2992.5 acres of non-project Indian lands under the Gila Crossing irrigation system.

31. Subject to the foregoing limitation the United States and/or its assigns may build for the San Carlos Irrigation Project such other storage and diversion dams on the Gila River or any of its tributaries at any point or points it may choose upstream from Sacaton Bridge and Diversion Dam. It is further agreed that subject to the same limitation the United States may drill such new wells and install pumps therein as it may deem necessary to more fully utilize its water rights enumerated in paragraph 9 hereof.

32. It is mutually understood that the acreage limitations enumerated in paragraph 30 hereof shall not be construed as applying to or in any way limiting the acreage which the United States may irrigate through the use of any or all of said storage and/or diversion dams to the extent that it may use them to store, release and/or divert water that may be brought into the channel of the Gila River from some other stream or streams not tributary thereto.

33. The Company hereby releases the United States and

the Pima Indians from all damages or claims of damage by reason of past, present or future irrigation of the hereinbefore described "Lone Butte" farm, the "Broadacres Ranch", the "Collier" lease farm and the "Cheatham" lease farm, and hereby agrees that this agreement shall be construed as including the consent of the Company for the Indians of the Gila Reservation, or the United States for them, to continue the irrigation of the aforesaid farms with water obtained in the manner aforesaid or by the drilling of new wells from time to time for the purpose of obtaining an adequate water supply to irrigate all or any of said four farm areas, and that irrespective of whether said lands shall be farmed and irrigated by the Indians or their lessees, the motion to dismiss and order of dismissal provided for in 29(2) hereof shall be deemed to bind the Company as to the farm areas and the irrigation thereof as described herein and in paragraphs 11 and 12.

34. It is mutually understood and agreed that this agreement shall not be construed as affecting or in any way limiting rights of the Maricopa Indians to the use of water from Salt River, which rights were determined, defined and described in the decree of the Federal Court for the District of Arizona in the case of United States of America vs. N. W. Haggard, et al., neither shall it be construed as in any way affecting or limiting the rights of the United States or its Indian wards to use water from the Salt River and tributaries for the irrigation of Indian lands on the Salt River and Fort McDowell Indian Reservations.

35. The Company hereby agrees that its release to the United States, as set forth in paragraphs 30 and 31 hereof, shall be construed as a waiver of any and all claims against the Indians of the San Carlos Indian Reservation and the Company does hereby disclaim any right or rights to the use of the Gila River water or its tributaries as against the Indians of said reservation.

36. No Member of, or Delegate to Congress, or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract, or to any benefit that may arise therefrom, but this restriction shall not be construed to extend to this contract if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

37. It is intended that the terms and provisions of this contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the United States and its assigns, the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, its successors or assigns, also the Gila River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community, and the Company, its successors and assigns and its stockholders and all landowners within the Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District and their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the parties hereto have executed or caused this agreement to be executed in duplicate original the day and year first above written.





Electrical District No. 8 of Maricopa County, Arizona ("ED-8"), acting on its own behalf and on behalf of its landowners and customers, hereby protests Application No. R-2021, as amended (the "Application") which was filed by the United States Bureau of Reclamation.

ED-8 is a political subdivision of the State of Arizona, and pursuant to A.R.S. §§48-1701, 48-1705 and 48-1747, ED-8 has an interest in the availability of its water supply and a duty to protect the power and related water interests of its landowners and customers.

ED-8 is located generally in the Gila Bend Groundwater Basin and Dendora Valley in southwestern Maricopa County. Irrigation of farmlands within ED-8 is primarily by pumped groundwater from aquifers recharged naturally by flows from the Gila River and its tributaries, including the Salt and Verde Rivers. In addition, landowners of ED-8 who divert water from

1 the Gila River will be required to pump additional groundwater if
2 those upstream flows are impounded and diverted for new uses
3 elsewhere. This additional pumping, with reduced recharge, will
4 increase the cost of power to ED-8 and will be detrimental to the
5 interests, welfare and safety of its landowners and customers.

6 ED-8 protests the Application for the following
7 reasons:

8 A. ED-8 and its landowners and customers will be
9 injured as a result of substantial increases in

F. The Application is not in proper form because:

1. For its irrigation or agricultural purposes, the Application does not list the legal subdivisions of the land and the acreage to be irrigated.

2. For its domestic or municipal uses, the Application does not specify the population to be served and the estimate of future population requirements.

3. For its recreational uses, the Application does not specify the location and the character of the area to be used and the specific purposes for which such area shall be used.

4. For its stockwatering purposes, the Application does not demonstrate the location and character of those uses.





17 Paloma Ranch is a large agricultural enterprise located
18 in southwest Maricopa County, Arizona. The water system of
19 Paloma Ranch is comprised of Gillespie Dam, the Gila Bend Canal,
20 a network of irrigation wells along the Canal which parallels the
21 Gila River, irrigation wells interspersed among the farmlands,
22 and numerous miles of laterals and ditches. Flows of the Gila
23 River and its tributaries are diverted at Gillespie Dam and
24 carried in the Gila Bend Canal for irrigation purposes.

25 Gillespie Dam is located in the Southeast quarter of
26 the Northeast quarter of Section 28, Township 2 South, Range 5
27 West. The concrete-lined Gila Bend Canal is approximately 35
28 miles long and delivers irrigation water to over 44,300 acres.
Paloma Ranch diverts and uses all waters reaching Gillespie Dam,
with the exception of (a) the first 10 cubic feet per second
(cfs) which has been decreed to Enterprise Ranch, (b) flows which
exceed the capacity of the Gila Bend Canal, which is in excess of

1 304 cfs at the headgate, and (c) when the Canal is drained for

3 Water diversions at the Gillespie Dam site for use on
4 lands of Paloma Ranch antedate 1881. Those water rights were

7 Court of Arizona, No. 14994-B, Findings of Fact, Conclusions of

9 The water rights of Paloma Ranch have been registered
10 and are explained in more detail in Water Rights Registration No.







By your letters of April 29, 1974, we have received two protests to the approval and granting of a permit in the above referenced application. These protests were submitted by Mr. Cyril B. Swanson, Bureau of Indian Affairs, on behalf of the San Carlos Indian Irrigation Project; and Mr. Robert E. Hurley, Attorney at Law, on behalf of the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District. The protests are similar in nature in that each favors and supports the construction of the Central Arizona Project, including Buttes Reservoir. However, each requests that any rights or permit granted by the State Land Department to the Bureau of Reclamation be made subject to the prior water rights set forth in the protest letters.

On the basis of the Gila River Decree, it is recognized that the only water subject to appropriation as against present rights would be the floodwaters which otherwise would flow over the four diversion points downstream from Buttes Dam site which serve the San Carlos Project and other lands having rights under the Gila Decree. Since the beginning of the administration of the Gila Decree through calendar year 1972, the average annual flow over the Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam has amounted to approximately 34,000 acre-feet. Such waters could only be conserved by the construction of storage facilities such as Buttes Dam and Reservoir. The Bureau of Reclamation's recent application was filed for the purpose of establishing a right under State law to store and use these waters.

Therefore, we agree that any right to store Gila River water in Buttes Reservoir should be subject to the prior rights of the San Carlos Indian Irrigation Project, and the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District.







In reply to your letter of March 28, 1974, transmitting a copy of a protest by Peter R. Kelly, Marie C. Kelly, and Ann M. Berryhill to the approval and granting of a permit in the reference application, we offer the following comments:

Buttes Dam and Reservoir, a proposed feature of the Central Arizona Project, was authorized for construction by the United States Congress under Public Law 90-537, Colorado River Basin Project Act, September 1968. As shown on the enclosed General Location Map, Buttes Dam site is located on the Gila River well below its junction with the San Pedro River. At its maximum capacity the reservoir formed behind Buttes Dam would extend upriver to about Kearney, Arizona, about 10 miles below the mouth of the San Pedro River.

Items 1(a), 1(b), 2, 3, and 4 of the protest letter all deal with questions internal to the San Pedro River Basin. Since the proposed Buttes Dam and Reservoir lie wholly outside this basin, we fail to see where its construction will have any influence on streamflow, ground water, or erosion within the San Pedro Basin. Such protests, warranted or not, would be more logically directed at the proposed Charleston Dam and Reservoir, also authorized for construction as a feature of the Central Arizona Project.

Charleston Dam site, also shown on the enclosed General Location Map, is located on the San Pedro River well upstream from the Kelly's land, and about 25 miles south of Benson, Arizona. Originally proposed to provide a source of municipal water supply to the city of Tucson, it appears now that waters developed by Charleston Dam and Reservoir would be used for municipal and industrial purposes within the San Pedro River Basin, primarily

Gentlemen:

Before the enactment of the first National Reclamation Law, construction of Buttes Dam on the Gila River was proposed and justified to assist in bringing irrigation water to the Gila River Indian Reservation. This dam is more needed today than it was in the first decade of the 20th Century. The Gila River Indian Community and its members strongly urge immediate construction of Buttes Dam. They urge that all proper State approvals be given.


The Gila River flows through the Gila River Indian Reservation. There are approximately 130,000 acres of arid irrigable land on this reservation. 50,546 acres of this arid irrigable land is included in the San Carlos Indian Irrigation Project and has the first (immemorial) right on the river to the use of 210,000 acre-feet per annum of the waters of the Gila River. 2,992 acres of the arid irrigable reservation land have decreed rights to use of waters of the Gila River. 1,080 acres of the arid irrigable reservation land have decreed rights to use of water of the Salt River. Under the Winters Doctrine (as reaffirmed by the United States Supreme Court in Arizona v. California) the remaining arid irrigable reservation lands are entitled to sufficient waters from the Gila River for their irrigation. We believe that 4.59 acre-feet per annum is a reasonable duty of this water.

The Gila River Indian Reservation is a small portion of the larger area which the Pima-Maricopa exclusively possessed, used and occupied at the time of and for more than 1,000 years before American sovereignty. The date of priority for use of Gila River water for Gila River Indian Reservation lands is therefore immemorial.

Any right to store Gila River water behind Buttes Dam should be shown to be subject to all Gila River Indian Reservation prior rights.



Enclosed in duplicate is an amendment to Application No. R-2021, dated June 9, 1960, for permit to construct Buttes Dam on the Gila River about 13 river miles downstream from Kelvin, Arizona, and to store unappropriated floodwaters of said river for beneficial use. This amendment results from several significant changes to the proposal described in the original 1960 application.

Buttes Dam and Reservoir was authorized for construction as a feature of the Central Arizona Project in Public Law 90-537, the Colorado River Project Act, in September 1968. Subsequent to authorization the Bureau has been engaged in advanced planning and preconstruction activities on various features of the project, including Buttes Dam. All physical data relating to the dam and reservoir are from preliminary designs and plans, and are subject to change as studies progress on the Central Arizona Project.

Your attention is called to several areas of the amended application where changes have been made from the original. Under paragraph 3., the location of delivery works cannot be fully described at this time since waters stored in Buttes Reservoir may be released through one or more outlets, the location(s) of which are not yet determined. The dam itself will be on lands withdrawn by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation; the reservoir will occupy portions of State lands along with land purchased from private ownership and other lands of the United States withdrawn for reclamation purposes.

Under paragraph 4., present thinking on the construction schedule is as shown, but is dependent on the availability of funds for such construction appropriated annually by the United States Congress.

Under paragraphs 5., 6., 7., 8., 9., and 10., the purposes and quantities to which the applied-for waters will be put to beneficial use are undetermined at this time, but are subject to the provisions of the authorizing act and the contract referenced under paragraph 5.

Under paragraph 13., changes from the original application were made in the length on top of the dam.

It is requested that no action be taken with respect to the granting of the permit applied for prior to the latter half of 1975. It is our understanding that the delay in processing the application and granting of the permit will in no way affect the priority represented by our original application in this matter.

The applicant, Acting Regional Director F. M. Warnick, is acting as the successor of Mr. A. B. West, former Regional Director, Region 3.

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

1. THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 29th day of May, Nineteen hundred Forty-five (1947), pursuant to authority of the Acts of Congress approved May 18, 1916 (39 Stat. 123-130), June 7, 1924 (43 Stat. 475) and March 7, 1928 (45 Stat. 200) and Acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, particularly the Act of July 3, 1945 (Public No. 123-79th Cong., 1st Sess. at page 14), by and between the United States of America, acting herein by the Secretary of the Interior, hereinafter referred to as the United States, and Buckeye Irrigation Company, an Arizona corporation, hereinafter referred to as the Company.

WITNESSETH THAT:

EXPLANATORY RECITALS

2. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and now owns the Florence-Casa Grande Irrigation Project, originally comprising approximately 62,000 acres of land, 35,000 acres of which were in the Gila River Indian Reservation, Arizona and the remaining 27,000 acres were and now are owned by non-Indians located upstream and just east of said reservation; and

3. WHEREAS, the United States owns and holds in trust all the water rights for said Florence-Casa Grande Project; and

4. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and now owns and operates the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project, Arizona; and

5. WHEREAS, said San Carlos Project now embraces 100,546 acres of land, 50,000 acres of which are within the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, a public corporation, and 50,546 acres are located within the Gila River Indian Reservation; and

(Recorded in Pinal County, Arizona, on September 29, 1947, in Book 7 of Contracts and Agreements, Page 570)

6. WHEREAS, all but approximately 1,545 acres of said Florence-Casa Grande Project lands were merged with and are included in the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project; and

7. WHEREAS, the United States owns and holds in trust all the water rights for the San Carlos Project lands including the water rights for the Florence-Casa Grande Project lands which have been merged with the San Carlos Project as aforesaid; and

8. WHEREAS, said water rights are all defined and described in detail in a decree of the United States District Court for Arizona, entered June 29, 1935, in the case of United States of America vs. Gila Valley Irrigation District, et al., the original of which is on file in the office of the Clerk of said Court and a copy thereof is also on file in the San Carlos Project office at Coolidge, Arizona; and

9. WHEREAS, the United States rights to use the waters of the Gila River for the irrigation of lands in said projects are (1) direct diversion rights, the earliest of which has an immemorial date of priority, (2) storage rights with a priority of not later than June 7, 1924, and (3) underground rights including the right to pump from the subsurface flow of the Gila River at any and all points between the San Carlos Project Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam and the western boundary of the said San Carlos Irrigation Project; and

10. WHEREAS, the United States also owns the right to divert and use water from the Gila River for the irrigation of 2992.5 acres of Indian land at the "Gila Crossing District" on the Gila River Reservation all of which have been irrigated and are now under Government owned canals which now divert water from the Gila River at points, about 13 and 17 miles respectively, east of and upstream from the place where the Salt River empties into the Gila River, all as provided for in said Federal Court Decree; and

11. WHEREAS, the United States also owns and holds in trust for Indians of the Gila Reservation 4465.505 acres of land comprising the "Lone Butte" farm containing 1989.62 acres, the "Broadacres Ranch" containing 1739.57 acres, the "Collier" lease farm containing 486.02 acres and the "Cheatham" lease farm containing 250.295 acres, which have been and now are being irrigated with water pumped from wells and "Tempe Drain" water, the right to the use of which

it also owns; and

12. WHEREAS, the Company is willing to waive any claim of past, present or future damages on account of past, present or future irrigation of the areas last aforesaid; and

13. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and owns and operates the Coolidge Dam and San Carlos Reservoir, the construction of which was sufficiently complete to allow the storage of water therein beginning November 15, 1928; and

14. WHEREAS, the Buckeye Irrigation Company owns and operates a diversion dam and canals near Buckeye, Arizona, which said irrigation facilities together with wells and pumps are and have been used by the Company to furnish irrigation water for landowners in the Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District; and

15. WHEREAS, each landowner in said District who owns or claims to own a water right also owns one share of Company stock for each acre of land; and

16. WHEREAS, said Buckeye Company diverts and uses water from the Gila River below the mouth of the Salt River; and

17. WHEREAS, the Company has pumped water from lands in said District to provide a substitute water supply for water losses which it claims to have suffered by reason of the construction of reservoirs on the Salt and Verde Rivers and by reason of increased pumping within the project of the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association and the Roosevelt Irrigation District, and other irrigation developments on the Agua Fria and elsewhere above the Company diversion structures; and

18. WHEREAS, the Company representing all the landowners in said Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District filed a suit in the Superior Court of Maricopa County, Arizona, against the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association, a corporation, and others in September, 1929, alleging among other things that the construction of reservoirs and other irrigation structures on the Salt River together with large scale pumping by the Association and the Roosevelt Irrigation District, also a defendant in said suit, had interfered with and diminished the supply of water theretofore available at the Company's diversion dam; and

19. WHEREAS, the Company also alleged that the construction of the Coolidge Dam and Reservoir by the United States and its use of stored water on the San Carlos Irrigation Project together with an alleged increased use of San Pedro water by said project had also interfered with and diminished the water supply of the Company and in an effort to curtail said alleged increased uses, the Company named as defendants the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, the San Carlos Project Engineer, the Superintendent of the Gila River Indian Reservation and numerous individual Indians of that Reservation; but the Company did not and does not now assert any claim to water rights adverse to the Indians of the San Carlos Reservation all of whose points of diversion are above Coolidge Dam; and

20. WHEREAS, the United States Attorney for Arizona appeared specially on behalf of the Project Engineer, the Superintendent and the individual Pima Indians for the purpose of questioning the jurisdiction of the Court and made formal suggestions to the Court that the suit was in effect one against the United States, since it owned all project water rights and the Coolidge Dam and the project diversion dams and all the other project works, and that therefore the Court had no jurisdiction over the subject matter of said suit; and

21. WHEREAS, thereafter the Company indicated its willingness to confer with all parties concerned for the purpose of working out a satisfactory settlement of the entire controversy and to that end suggested that the Secretary of the Interior could facilitate a settlement of all the matters by appointing a disinterested person to act as mediator; and

22. WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Interior thereafter appointed the Honorable Clifford H. Stone of Denver, Colorado, as Mediator who conducted mediation proceedings over a period of several years and worked with the various parties in an effort to assist the Company in reaching a mutually satisfactory settlement of its grievances with each of the other projects which the Company claimed had interfered with its water supply; and

23. WHEREAS, the Company has made satisfactory settlements with all of said other projects and companies; and

24. WHEREAS, although the United States has contended that its water rights were superior to those of the Company

and its landowners, the San Carlos Irrigation Project representatives have conceded that future construction of additional works contemplated by the United States to make a more effective use of its irrigation system and water physically available for the San Carlos Irrigation Project might diminish the amount of water in the Gila River at a point 100 feet above the mouth of the Salt River and thereby invade the rights of the Company; and

25. WHEREAS, the Company by reason of the diminishing of its water supply as set forth in paragraphs 17, 18 and 19 hereof has been compelled to borrow money with which to drill wells and install pumps to furnish a substitute water supply to partially offset said losses and provide against the aforesaid future increased uses by the San Carlos Project; and

26. WHEREAS, the United States, in order to reconcile its differences with the Company and settle all past disputes and avoid future controversy with the Company over the right of the United States to control and use the waters of the Gila River and its tributaries above the mouth of the Salt River, is willing to pay the Company for a release of its past, present and future claims against the United States on account of the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project as now constituted or as it may hereafter be improved by the construction of new dams, (such as the "Buttes") reservoirs or other facilities to make Gila River water more completely available to said project and the other lands hereinbefore mentioned, located at Gila Crossing, also the Florence-Casa Grande Project lands not included in said San Carlos Project; and

27. WHEREAS, in view of the satisfactory arrangements the Company has made with the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association and other users on the Salt River and its tributaries the Company is willing to dismiss its suit with prejudice as to the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, San Carlos Project officials, Superintendent A. E. Robinson and all of the Pima and/or Maricopa Indians and waive all claims to the use of water from the Gila River at and above Gila Crossing in the future upon receipt of the sum of money hereinafter provided for and upon the terms and conditions set forth in this agreement.

28. NOW, THEREFORE, in order to adjust and settle the existing controversy, promote the welfare of the San Carlos

Federal Irrigation Project, avoid future controversies, and in consideration of the premises and the covenants hereinafter contained and the payment by the United States to the Company the sum of One Hundred Four Thousand, Four Hundred Dollars (\$104,400.00) as hereinafter provided it is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

29. The United States shall pay the Company for and on behalf of its stockholders the sum of One Hundred Four Thousand, Four Hundred Dollars (\$104,400.00) in accordance with Government fiscal regulations upon the occurrence of the following events:

- (1) The approval of this agreement by appropriate and satisfactory resolutions duly and regularly adopted by:
 - a. The stockholders of the Buckeye Irrigation Company, a corporation,
 - b. The Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District,
 - c. The San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District and
 - d. The Gila River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Council.
- (2) The filing of a motion to dismiss by the Buckeye Irrigation Company with the Clerk of the Superior Court of Maricopa County, Arizona, and the entry of a due and regular court order based thereon, dismissing with prejudice both as to the Company and the landowners within the Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District, the Company's suit against the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, Project Engineer C. J. Moody, and Superintendent A. E. Robinson in their official and individual capacities and each of the Pima and/or other Indians named in said suit.
- (3) Availability of the funds appropriated by Congress in the aforesaid Act of July 3, 1945.
- (4) The due and regular execution of this agreement by the parties hereto.

30. The Company acknowledges the receipt of said sum of \$104,400.00 and hereby fully and in all respects releases the United States, the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, and the Pima Indians from all damages or claims of damage by reason of past, present or future operation and use of Coolidge Dam and the storage of Gila River water in the San Carlos Reservoir, for the past, present or future diversions of water at Ashurst-Hayden and Sacaton Diversion Dams, also on account of the construction of any new storage and/or diversion dams on the Gila or its tributaries above the Sacaton Bridge and Diversion Dam and/or the storage of water therein or diversions therefrom, and for past, present or future diversions at Gila Crossing for the irrigation of the hereinbefore mentioned 2992.5 acres of Indian lands, PROVIDED, that the construction of new reservoirs or other storage works that may be built by the United States or its assigns to store and divert additional quantities of Gila River waters together with existing reservoirs and other works shall not be used for the purpose of irrigating more than 100,546 acres of San Carlos Irrigation Project lands plus 1545 acres of Florence-Casa Grande Project lands not in the San Carlos Project and said 2992.5 acres of non-project Indian lands under the Gila Crossing irrigation system.

31. Subject to the foregoing limitation the United States and/or its assigns may build for the San Carlos Irrigation Project such other storage and diversion dams on the Gila River or any of its tributaries at any point or points it may choose upstream from Sacaton Bridge and Diversion Dam. It is further agreed that subject to the same limitation the United States may drill such new wells and install pumps therein as it may deem necessary to more fully utilize its water rights enumerated in paragraph 9 hereof.

32. It is mutually understood that the acreage limitations enumerated in paragraph 30 hereof shall not be construed as applying to or in any way limiting the acreage which the United States may irrigate through the use of any or all of said storage and/or diversion dams to the extent that it may use them to store, release and/or divert water that may be brought into the channel of the Gila River from some other stream or streams not tributary thereto.

33. The Company hereby releases the United States and

the Pima Indians from all damages or claims of damage by reason of past, present or future irrigation of the herein-before described "Lone Butte" farm, the "Broadacres Ranch", the "Collier" lease farm and the "Cheatham" lease farm, and hereby agrees that this agreement shall be construed as including the consent of the Company for the Indians of the Gila Reservation, or the United States for them, to continue the irrigation of the aforesaid farms with water obtained in the manner aforesaid or by the drilling of new wells from time to time for the purpose of obtaining an adequate water supply to irrigate all or any of said four farm areas, and that irrespective of whether said lands shall be farmed and irrigated by the Indians or their lessees, the motion to dismiss and order of dismissal provided for in 29(2) hereof shall be deemed to bind the Company as to the farm areas and the irrigation thereof as described herein and in paragraphs 11 and 12.

34. It is mutually understood and agreed that this agreement shall not be construed as affecting or in any way limiting rights of the Maricopa Indians to the use of water from Salt River, which rights were determined, defined and described in the decree of the Federal Court for the District of Arizona in the case of United States of America vs. N. W. Haggard, et al., neither shall it be construed as in any way affecting or limiting the rights of the United States or its Indian wards to use water from the Salt River and tributaries for the irrigation of Indian lands on the Salt River and Fort McDowell Indian Reservations.

35. The Company hereby agrees that its release to the United States, as set forth in paragraphs 30 and 31 hereof, shall be construed as a waiver of any and all claims against the Indians of the San Carlos Indian Reservation and the Company does hereby disclaim any right or rights to the use of the Gila River water or its tributaries as against the Indians of said reservation.

36. No Member of, or Delegate to Congress, or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract, or to any benefit that may arise therefrom, but this restriction shall not be construed to extend to this contract if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

37. It is intended that the terms and provisions of this contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the United States and its assigns, the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, its successors or assigns, also the Gila River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community, and the Company, its successors and assigns and its stockholders and all landowners within the Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District and their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.



STATEMENT TO ACCOMPANY SECTIONS 18 AND 19
OF APPLICATION TO APPROPRIATE WATER FOR
BUTTES DAM RESERVOIR

The Buckeye Irrigation Company and the Arlington Canal Company, have, in the past, made claim to waters of the Gila River system which includes some of the waters that it is intended will be impounded by the proposed Buttes Dam. The United States, however, has secured a release and waiver for all damages which might arise from actions that might interfere with any rights that the Buckeye Irrigation Company or Arlington Canal Company may have in the flow of the Gila River. Contracts with these companies entered into pursuant to Act of Congress (59 Stat. 318, 330), copies of which are attached hereto, specifically granted a waiver of future damages that these companies might sustain by reason of the United States constructing any new works on the Gila River, upstream from the Sacaton Diversion Dam, to impound or divert waters to which these companies may be entitled. The Buttes Dam will be located upstream from the Sacaton Diversion Dam. See particularly sections 26, 30, 31, and 35 of the above-mentioned agreements.

The United States owns the right to divert water from the Gila River for the irrigation of 2992.5 acres of land located within the Gila River Indian Reservation in the Gila Crossing District. These rights are downstream from the proposed Buttes Dam. The Gila Decree, however, specifically subordinates these rights to those of the San Carlos Irrigation Project, and further provides, among other things, that the San Carlos Irrigation Project may divert and use water otherwise occurring in the river above the points of diversion for the Gila Crossing District lands. See Article VI (6) of the decree in the case of United States v. Gila Valley Irrigation District, et al.

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

SAN CARLOS FEDERAL IRRIGATION PROJECT

and

ARLINGTON CANAL COMPANY

1. THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 29th day of May, ~~Nineteen hundred Forty-five (1945)~~, 1947, pursuant to authority of the Acts of Congress approved May 18, 1916 (39 Stat. 123-130), June 7, 1924 (43 Stat. 475) and March 7, 1928 (45 Stat. 200) and Acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, particularly the Act of July 3, 1945 (Public No. 123-79th Cong., 1st Sess. at page 14), by and between the United States of America, acting herein by the Secretary of the Interior, hereinafter referred to as the United States, and Arlington Canal Company, an Arizona corporation, hereinafter referred to as the Company.

WITNESSETH THAT:

EXPLANATORY RECITALS

2. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and now owns the Florence-Casa Grande Irrigation Project, originally comprising approximately 62,000 acres of land, 35,000 acres of which were in the Gila River Indian Reservation, Arizona and the remaining 27,000 acres were and now are owned by non-Indians located upstream and just east of said reservation; and

3. WHEREAS, the United States owns and holds in trust all the water rights for said Florence-Casa Grande Project; and

4. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and now owns and operates the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project, Arizona; and

(Recorded in Pinal County, Arizona, on September 29, 1947, in Book 7 of Contracts and Agreements, Page 564)

5. WHEREAS, said San Carlos Project now embraces 100,546 acres of land, 50,000 acres of which are within the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, a public corporation, and 50,546 acres are located within the Gila River Indian Reservation; and

6. WHEREAS, all but approximately 1,545 acres of said Florence-Casa Grande Project lands were merged with and are included in the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project; and

7. WHEREAS, the United States owns and holds in trust all the water rights for the San Carlos Project lands including the water rights for the Florence-Casa Grande Project lands which have been merged with the San Carlos Project as aforesaid; and

8. WHEREAS, said water rights are all defined and described in detail in a decree of the United States District Court for Arizona, entered June 29, 1935, in the case of United States of America vs. Gila Valley Irrigation District, et al., the original of which is on file in the office of the Clerk of said Court and a copy thereof is also on file in the San Carlos Project office at Coolidge, Arizona; and

9. WHEREAS, the United States rights to use the waters of the Gila River for the irrigation of lands in said projects are (1) direct diversion rights, the earliest of which has an immemorial date of priority, (2) storage rights with a priority of not later than June 7, 1924, and (3) underground rights including the right to pump from the subsurface flow of the Gila River at any and all points between the San Carlos Project Ashurst-Hayden Diversion Dam and the western boundary of the said San Carlos Irrigation Project; and

10. WHEREAS, the United States also owns the right to divert and use water from the Gila River for the irrigation of 2992.5 acres of Indian land at the "Gila Crossing District" on the Gila River Reservation all of which have been irrigated and are now under Government owned canals which now divert water from the Gila River at points, about 13 and 17 miles respectively, east of and upstream from the place where the Salt River empties into the Gila River, all as provided for in said Federal Court Decree; and

11. WHEREAS, the United States also owns and holds in trust for Indians of the Gila Reservation 4465.505 acres of land comprising the "Lone Butte" farm containing 1989.62 acres, the "Broadacres Ranch" containing 1739.57 acres, the "Collier" lease farm containing 486.02 acres and the "Cheatham" lease farm containing 250.295 acres, which have been and now are being irrigated with water pumped from wells and "Tempe Drain" water, the right to the use of which it also owns; and

12. WHEREAS, the Company is willing to waive any claim of past, present or future damages on account of past, present or future irrigation of the areas last aforesaid; and

13. WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and owns and operates the Coolidge Dam and San Carlos Reservoir, the construction of which was sufficiently complete to allow the storage of water therein beginning November 15, 1928; and

14. WHEREAS, the Arlington Canal Company owns and operates a diversion dam and other intake structures and canals on the Gila River downstream from the Buckeye Irrigation Company's diversion dam which said irrigation facilities have been used by the Company to furnish irrigation water to and for its landowner stockholders; and

15. WHEREAS, the Company's landowners all own or claim to own a water right evidenced by one share of Company stock for each one hundred and sixty acre tract of land or part of one share of Company stock in each case where a Company landowner has less than one hundred and sixty acres of irrigable land under said Company irrigation system; and

16. WHEREAS, said Company diverts and uses water from the Gila River below the mouth of the Salt River at a point near or below the lower boundary of the Buckeye Irrigation Company project; and

17. WHEREAS, the Company has used water pumped from lands in or adjacent to the Buckeye Water Conservation and Drainage District to provide a substitute water supply for the losses it claims its landowners have suffered by reason of the construction of reservoirs on the Salt and Verde Rivers and by reason of increased pumping within the Project of the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association and the Roosevelt Irrigation District and other irrigation developments thereon and on the Agua Fria and elsewhere above the

Arlington Canal Company's diversion dam and/or other intake facilities; and

18. WHEREAS, the Company representing all the land-owners who receive water from or claim the right to use water from the Gila River through the facilities of the Arlington Canal Company system filed, as co-plaintiff with the Buckeye Irrigation Company, a suit in the Superior Court of Maricopa County, Arizona, against the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association, a corporation, and others in September, 1929, alleging among other things that the construction of reservoirs and other irrigation structures on the Salt River together with large scale pumping by the Association and the Roosevelt Irrigation District, also a defendant in said suit, had interfered with and diminished the supply of water theretofore available at the Company's diversion dam and other intake structures; and

19. WHEREAS, the Company also alleged that the construction of the Coolidge Dam and Reservoir by the United States and its use of stored water on the San Carlos Irrigation Project together with an alleged increased use of San Pedro water by said project had also interfered with and diminished the water supply of the Company and in an effort to curtail said alleged increased uses, the Company named as defendants the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, the San Carlos Project Engineer, the Superintendent of the Gila River Indian Reservation and numerous individual Indians of that Reservation; but the Company did not and does not now assert any claim to water rights adverse to the Indians of the San Carlos Reservation all of whose points of diversion are above Coolidge Dam; and

20. WHEREAS, the United States Attorney for Arizona appeared specially on behalf of the Project Engineer, the Superintendent and the individual Pima Indians for the purpose of questioning the jurisdiction of the Court and made formal suggestions to the Court that the suit was in effect one against the United States, since it owned all project water rights and the Coolidge Dam and the project diversion dams and all the other project works and that therefore the Court had no jurisdiction over the subject matter of said suit; and

21. WHEREAS, thereafter the Company indicated its willingness to confer with all parties concerned for the purpose of working out a satisfactory settlement of the entire controversy; and

22. WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Interior thereafter appointed the Honorable Clifford H. Stone of Denver, Colorado, as Mediator who conducted mediation proceedings over a period of several years and worked with the various parties in an effort to assist the Company in reaching a mutually satisfactory settlement of its grievances with each of the other projects which the Company claimed had interfered with its water supply; and

23. WHEREAS, the Company has made satisfactory settlements with all of said other projects and companies; and

24. WHEREAS, although the United States has contended that its water rights were superior to those of the Company and its landowners, the San Carlos Irrigation Project representatives have conceded that future construction of additional works contemplated by the United States to make a more effective use of its irrigation system and water physically available for the San Carlos Irrigation Project might diminish the amount of water in the Gila River at a point 100 feet above the mouth of the Salt River and thereby invade the rights of the Company; and

29. The United States shall pay the Company for and on behalf of its stockholders the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) in accordance with Government fiscal regulations upon the occurrence of the following events:

- (1) The approval of this agreement by appropriate and satisfactory resolutions duly and regularly adopted by:
 - a. The stockholders of the Arlington Canal Company, a corporation,
 - b. The San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District and
 - c. The Gila River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Council.
- (2) The filing of a motion to dismiss by the Arlington Canal Company with the Clerk of the Superior Court of Maricopa County, Arizona, and the entry of a due and regular court order based thereon, dismissing with prejudice both as to the Company and its stockholders and all landowners, represented

by it, the Company's suit against the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, Project Engineer C. J. Moody, and Superintendent A. E. Robinson in their official and individual capacities and each of the Pima and/or other Indians named in said suit.

The Company acknowledges the receipt of said sum of \$10,000.00 and hereby fully and in all respects releases the United States, the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, and the Pima Indians from all damages or claims of damage by reason of past, present or future operation and use of Coolidge Dam and the storage of Gila River water in the San Carlos Reservoir, for the past, present or future diversions of water at Ashurst-Hayden and Sacaton Diversion Dams, also on account of the construction of any new storage and/or diversion dams on the Gila or its tributaries above the Sacaton Bridge and Diversion Dam and/or the storage of water therein or diversions therefrom, and for past, present or future diversions at Gila Crossing for the irrigation of the hereinbefore mentioned 2992.5 acres of Indian lands, PROVIDED, that the construction of new reservoirs or other storage works that may be built by the United States or its assigns to store and divert additional quantities of Gila River waters together with existing reservoirs and other works shall not be used for the purpose of irrigating more than 100,546 acres of San Carlos Irrigation Project lands plus 1545 acres of Florence-Casa Grande Project lands not in the San Carlos Project and said 2992.5 acres of non-project Indian lands under the Gila Crossing irrigation system.

31. Subject to the foregoing limitation the United States and/or its assigns may build for the San Carlos Irrigation Project such other storage and diversion dams on the Gila or any of its tributaries at any point or points it may choose upstream from Sacaton Bridge and Diversion Dam. It is further agreed that subject to the same limitation the United States may drill such new wells and install pumps therein as it may deem necessary to more

fully utilize its water rights enumerated in paragraph 9 hereof.

32. It is mutually understood that the acreage limitations enumerated in paragraph 30 hereof shall not be construed as applying to or in any way limiting the acreage which the United States may irrigate through the use of any or all of said storage and/or diversion dams to the extent that it may use them to store, release and/or divert water that may be brought into the channel of the Gila River from some other stream or streams not tributary thereto.

33. The Company hereby releases the United States and the Pima Indians from all damages or claims of damage by reason of past, present or future irrigation of the hereinbefore described "Lone Butte" farm, the "Broadacres Ranch", the "Collier" lease farm and the "Cheatham" lease farm, and hereby agrees that this agreement shall be construed as including the consent of the Company for the Indians of the Gila Reservation, or the United States for them, to continue the irrigation of the aforesaid farms with water obtained in the manner aforesaid or by the drilling of new wells from time to time for the purpose of obtaining an adequate water supply to irrigate all or any of said four farm areas, and that irrespective of whether said lands shall be farmed and irrigated by the Indians or their lessees, the motion to dismiss and order of dismissal provided for in 29(2) hereof shall be deemed to bind the Company as to the farm areas and the irrigation thereof as described herein and in paragraphs 11 and 12.

34. It is mutually understood and agreed that this agreement shall not be construed as affecting or in any way limiting rights of the Maricopa Indians to the use of water from Salt River, which rights were determined, defined and described in the decree of the Federal Court for the District of Arizona in the case of United States of America vs. N. W. Haggard et al., neither shall it be construed as in any way affecting or limiting the rights of the United States or its Indian wards to use water from the Salt River and tributaries for the irrigation of Indian lands on the Salt River and Fort McDowell Indian Reservations.

35. The Company hereby agrees that its release to the United States, as set forth in paragraphs 30 and 31 hereof,

shall be construed as a waiver of any and all claims against the Indians of the San Carlos Indian Reservation and the Company does hereby disclaim any right or rights to the use of the Gila River water or its tributaries as against the Indians of said reservation.

36. No Member of, or Delegate to Congress, or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract, or to any benefit that may arise therefrom, but this restriction shall not be construed to extend to this contract if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

37. It is intended that the terms and provisions of this contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the United States and its assigns, the San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District, its successors or assigns, also the Gila River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community, and the Company, its successors and assigns and all its stockholders and landowner water users and their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.

12 Comes now the Regional Director, Region 3, of the Bureau of Reclamation
13 and by way of Answer to Protest of the City of Tucson, a municipal corporation, to
14 Application No. R-2021 for a permit to appropriate the public waters of the State
15 of Arizona, admits, denies and alleges as follows:

16 I

17 That in answer to paragraph 1 of the Protest filed by said City, Applicant
18 alleges that it has been and is now the public policy of the State of Arizona to put
19 to the greatest beneficial use the waters within said State (Pima Farms Co. vs.
20 Proctor, 30 Ariz. 96). Applicant further alleges that the demand of said City
21 that water be reserved for it is based upon speculation and should be rejected.
22 That Exhibit 1 referred to in said paragraph of the Protest of said City is merely
23 a map showing a general area from which the City wishes to take water and a proposed
24 conduit system.

25 Applicant recognizes the existence of the so-called priority of use
26 statute granting preference to municipal uses over irrigation uses (ARS 45-147),
27 but further alleges that such statute only applies to conflicting applications as
28 distinguished from a conflict between an application premised on future use and an
29 existing use or vested right. That the proposed plan of said City as reflected in
30 said Exhibit 1 has no provision for hold-over storage capacity and therefore would
31 be infeasible if the waters were taken only from unappropriated flood waters of
32 the San Pedro River. That Applicant is informed and believes and therefore alleges

1 that the proposed plan of said City as reflected on Exhibit 1, would conflict with
2 and would be in derogation of presently existing and vested rights of the United
3 States to the use of the normal flow of the Gila River system, which said rights
4 were granted and confirmed in the case of The United States of America vs. The Gila
5 Valley Irrigation District, et al., Globe Equity No. 59, in the United States
6 District Court in and for the District of Arizona.

7 II

8 That in answer to paragraph 2 of the Protest of said City, Applicant
9 admits the filing of applications as alleged therein, but affirmatively alleges
10 that said City has no definite plans nor a presently existing need for the use of
11 the waters of the San Pedro River. It is further alleged that should the applica-
12 tion of the Bureau of Reclamation be denied and those of said City upheld, that
13 the flood waters of the San Pedro River would be wasted and dissipated for an
14 indefinite period in the future while the City endeavors to make plans as to how
15 much water it would need from the San Pedro River, how it should be obtained and
16 how much will be required to satisfy the needs of an assumed population which may
17 or may not exist in the indefinite future.

18 It is further alleged that a purported reservation of waters from
19 present appropriation for use in the indefinite future by another potential user
20 would be in derogation of the public policy of the State of Arizona in that it

24 That Applicant is without knowledge of the allegations in paragraphs 4
25 and 5 of the Protest of said City, but alleges that said allegations lack a present
26 intention to proceed pursuant thereto.

28 Applicant affirmatively alleges that it is the public policy of the
29 State of Arizona to put the waters of said State to beneficial use and not permit
30 waste and dissipation thereof. That in the past large quantities of flood waters
31 have passed over the diversion dams of the United States maintained for the
32 benefit of San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project, the Florence-Casa Grande Project



PROTEST OF THE
CITY OF TUCSON

COMES NOW the City of Tucson, a municipal corporation of the State of Arizona, located in Pima County, Arizona, and respectfully protests against the granting of the permit applied for by Application No. R-2021 filed with the Arizona State Land Commissioner on June 9, 1960, by the Bureau of Reclamation of the United States Department of the Interior on behalf of the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project to appropriate waters of the Gila River and to divert same in the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 11, Township 4 South, Range 11 East, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Pinal County, Arizona, for irrigation uses for the following reasons:

(1) If the said Application No. R-2021 be granted, the City of Tucson may be prevented from using for consumptive use waters of the San Pedro River in the vicinity of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 33, Township 12 South, Range 19 East, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Cochise County, Arizona (hereinafter sometimes referred to as the Cascabel Properties), which will be vitally needed to meet the demands of its residents for domestic and municipal uses by the year 1970, all as proposed on Exhibit 1 attached hereto and made a part hereof as if fully set forth herein. Further, if said Application No. R-2021 be granted, the water consumers

of the City of Tucson might be required to pay a proportionate share of the cost of the Buttes Dam Project of the Bureau of Reclamation although municipal uses are of a higher priority than irrigation uses as set forth in Section 45-147, Arizona Revised Statutes.

(2) The City of Tucson, simultaneously with the filing of this protest, has filed an application for a permit with the Arizona State Land Commissioner to appropriate 30,000 acre feet of water per annum of the public waters of the State of Arizona, and has heretofore filed applications to appropriate public waters of the State of Arizona and to construct a reservoir and to store for beneficial use unappropriated waters of the State of Arizona on or about April 7, 1947, which applications are still on file and which have neither been granted nor denied to the date hereof. These latter applications relate to the appropriation of public waters of the San Pedro River (a tributary of the Gila River) and the erection of a dam in the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 2, Township 21 South, Range 21 East, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Cochise County, Arizona, known as the site of the proposed Charleston Dam, and which said applications the City of Tucson respectfully submits are presently pending before the Arizona State Land Commissioner, in view of the language contained in Section 45-150, Arizona Revised Statutes. Since the filing of the said applications in 1947 the City of Tucson (during June, 1960) has purchased the Cascabel Properties and is now the owner in fee of 4,877.55 acres, together with Federal Grazing Permits for 160.18 acres, and is now in the process of transferring from the assignors thereof 13,693.75 acres of State grazing lands, all in Townships 12 and 13 South, Ranges 19 and 20 East, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Cochise County, Arizona, as indicated

on the annexed Exhibit 1.

- (3) (a) The present use of water on the lands owned, leased by, and under permit to, the City of Tucson (the Cascabel Properties) as described in paragraph (2) hereof, is as follows:

800 acre feet per annum by irrigation;
6,400 acre feet per annum by phreatophytes; and
182 acre feet per annum by evaporation.

- (b) The amount of land involved is as follows:

Land irrigated 264 acres;
Phreatophyte land. 1,600 acres; and
Evaporation land 26 acres.

- (c) The City of Tucson may acquire additional similar lands in fee in order to produce a total of 30,000 acre feet per annum in the vicinity of the Cascabel Properties shown on Exhibit 1 in order that the City may obtain 30,000 acre feet per annum from percolating groundwater and/or stream or subterranean stream waters of the San Pedro River at the site of the proposed Charleston Dam and/or at the Cascabel Properties, both more fully described in paragraph (2) hereof.

(4) The lands held by the City of Tucson at this time are as shown on Exhibit 1. The proposed point of diversion is as shown on Exhibit 1 within the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 33, Township 12 South, Range 19 East, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Cochise County, Arizona.

(5) Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto, indicates the area owned, leased by, or under permit to, the City of Tucson, the proposed water collector pipeline, the proposed aqueduct from the point of diversion to the present terminal of the water distribution system within the corporate limits of the City of Tucson, and the proposed storage reservoir and pumping sites.

WHEREFORE, the City of Tucson respectfully urges that Application No. R-2021 of the Bureau of Reclamation of the United States Department of the Interior be denied and that no permit issue for the construction of a reservoir at Buttes Dam nor for the appropriation of waters of the Gila River if such appropriation will deny the City of Tucson the appropriation of 30,000 acre feet per annum from the San Pedro River.

This letter is to protest application R-2021 of the Bureau of Reclamation of the U. S. Department of the Interior for the benefit of the San Carlos Federal Irrigation Project, filed June 9, 1960, on grounds that:

The application of the San Carlos interests for all of the un-allocated water of the San Pedro is unfair, unjust, and unreasonable, because:


(a) Make possible a constant controlled flow of water down the San Pedro in contrast to its present pattern of dry bed most of the time, an overload of flood waters during the short rainy season

This should provide San Carlos with a reasonable share of the watershed drainage, and would leave the upper drainage area for use by Tucson, St. David, Pomerene, and other portions of Cochise county, which is faced with a coming population "explosion" of its own, and must look ahead the same years as does Tucson to a source of water to provide for its own future domestic needs.

It has just come to our attention that the Butte Dam project covered by Application No R 2021, Bureau of Reclamation of the Department of the Interior, would claim all "Unappropriated water of the San Pedro" and we wish to immediately register our objections.

Since 1887, the Charleston Damsite has been considered for storing the waters of the San Pedro; in 1903 the Secretary of the Interior passed on it for further survey and it has become a part of the Central Arizona Project.

As early as 1947, Tucson filed for 12,000 feet of its waters and certainly now, with its great potential growth, its domestic requirements should be given first consideration. St David too, strictly an agricultural community has applied for 18,000 acre ft and with the fast growing communities around Fort Huachuca, it is important that a good water level be maintained for domestic purposes.

Another factor but an important by-product, would be the recreational area it would afford for the Southern part of the State of Arizona. Central Arizona and the northern portion of the State are blessed with several dams whereas this area has none of note.

In the interests of preserving sufficient water supplies in this area for domestic use, we earnestly ask that you defer action on the San Carlos project and we hope that Charleston Dam will be given your favorable approval.

Sir:

We, as landowners adjoining the San Pedro River, hereby protest the application of The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation to appropriate water from the San Pedro for use of San Carlos Irrigation Project.

We would be injured by possible future manipulation of this right by the applicant. We would also be and are presently being injured by the applicants failure to control the water to which they already lay claim and by the constant opposition and prevention of any effective flood control project or projects or by any possibility of construction of structures to slow down or control these waters.

We have irrigated and are irrigating land from pump water. This may be affected by enlargement of San Carlos already considerable power to dictate to us.

We own the north half of Section 31 Twp 13 S. Rg. 20 E. G. & S.R. B.M.M., Cochise County, Arizona, except 10 acres.

Three times in the last three years we have built on Teran Wash (and not with ACP aid) structures to try to prevent further erosion of our land. These structures, because of upstream denudation and the velocity of runoff, have in each case been completely destroyed.

Now, these people may be successful in their application to you for water, but I deny their right to take my land. To paraphrase Portia "give thee here no jot of blood; "take thou thy pound of flesh; but in the cutting, if thou dost shed one drop of Christian blood, thy lands are confiscate....."

Quite a few new concepts of law and right and wrong are in the making and may be hastened by Judge Rifkinds Colorado River decision and I say we do have some Riparian Rights and I do say that the San Carlos people have not built the Buttes Dam and may never build it. This application is no more than a demand for naked power (of which San Carlos already has plenty) to coerce and harass us people above them. No matter how much water they get they will never have enough to satisfy them or to make their project a success; nor will the Indians get much of it nor of the benefits that flow from it.


WHEREAS, such allocation would forever restrict the upper San Pedro Valley from any future growth, and


