



The purpose of this letter is to remind you that an update to the 2008 System Water Plan for LAMPLIGHTER RV RESORT (91-000158.0000) is due to the Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) on or before January 25, 2013.

This due date applies to all small community water systems (serving less than 1,850 persons) in the state as defined in Arizona Revised Statutes § 45-342 who submitted a complete system Water Plan in 2008. The requirement to submit a System Water Plan was established by Arizona House Bill 2277, passed by the Arizona legislature in 2005 and established in the Arizona Revised Statutes 45-342. The requirement is part of a larger set of recommendations made by the governor's Drought Task Force. The System Water Plan has three sections -- Water Supply Plan, Drought Plan and Conservation Plan -- and must be updated every five years. The plan is intended to reduce a community water system's vulnerability to drought and ensure that it is prepared to respond to drought or water shortage conditions. The information submitted by water systems helps the State determine regional assistance needed for drought planning, mitigation and response.
